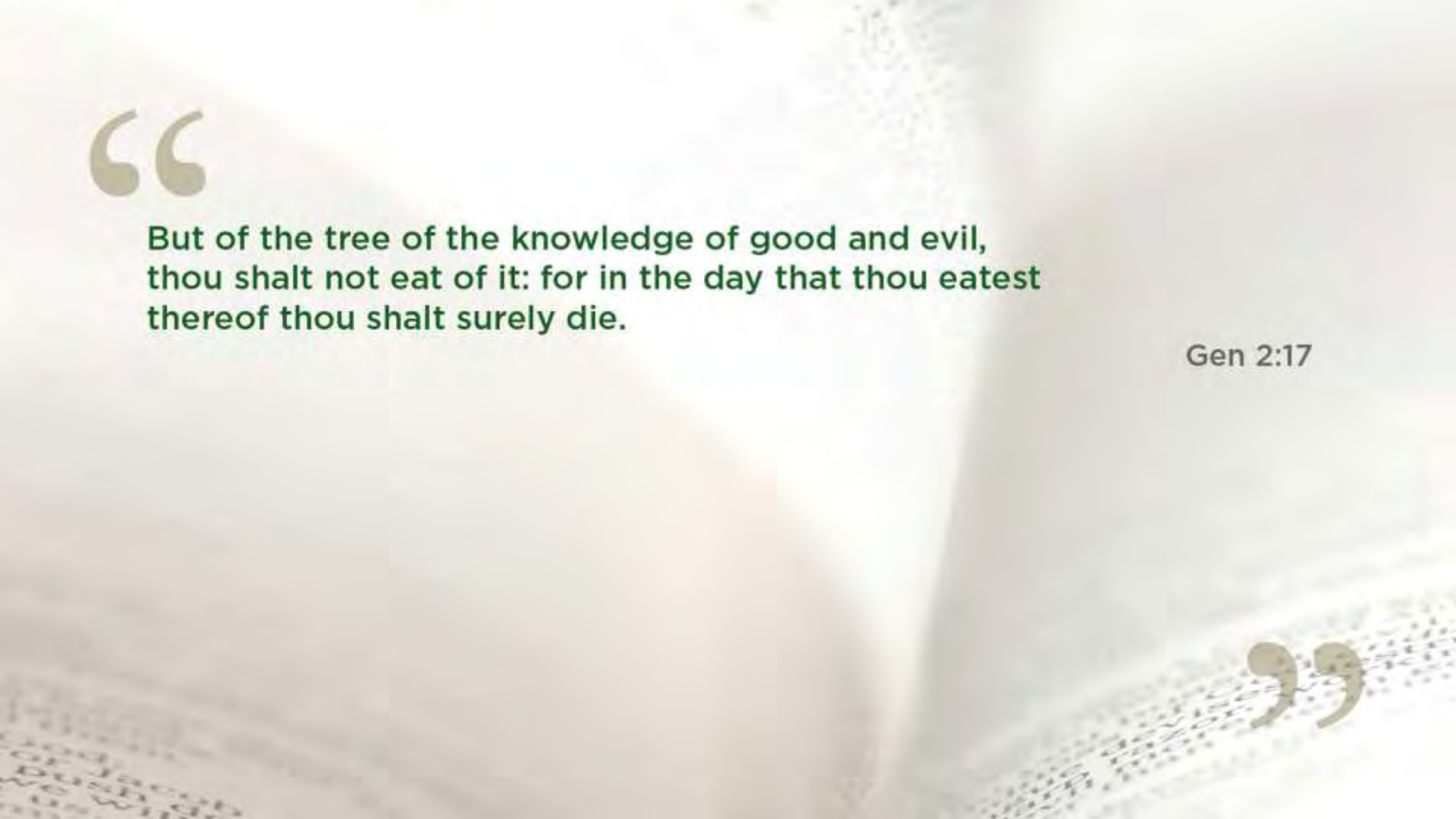

The **Root of Sin** (Original Sin)

To understand this, we look at the **fruit of the tree** of the knowledge of good and evil.



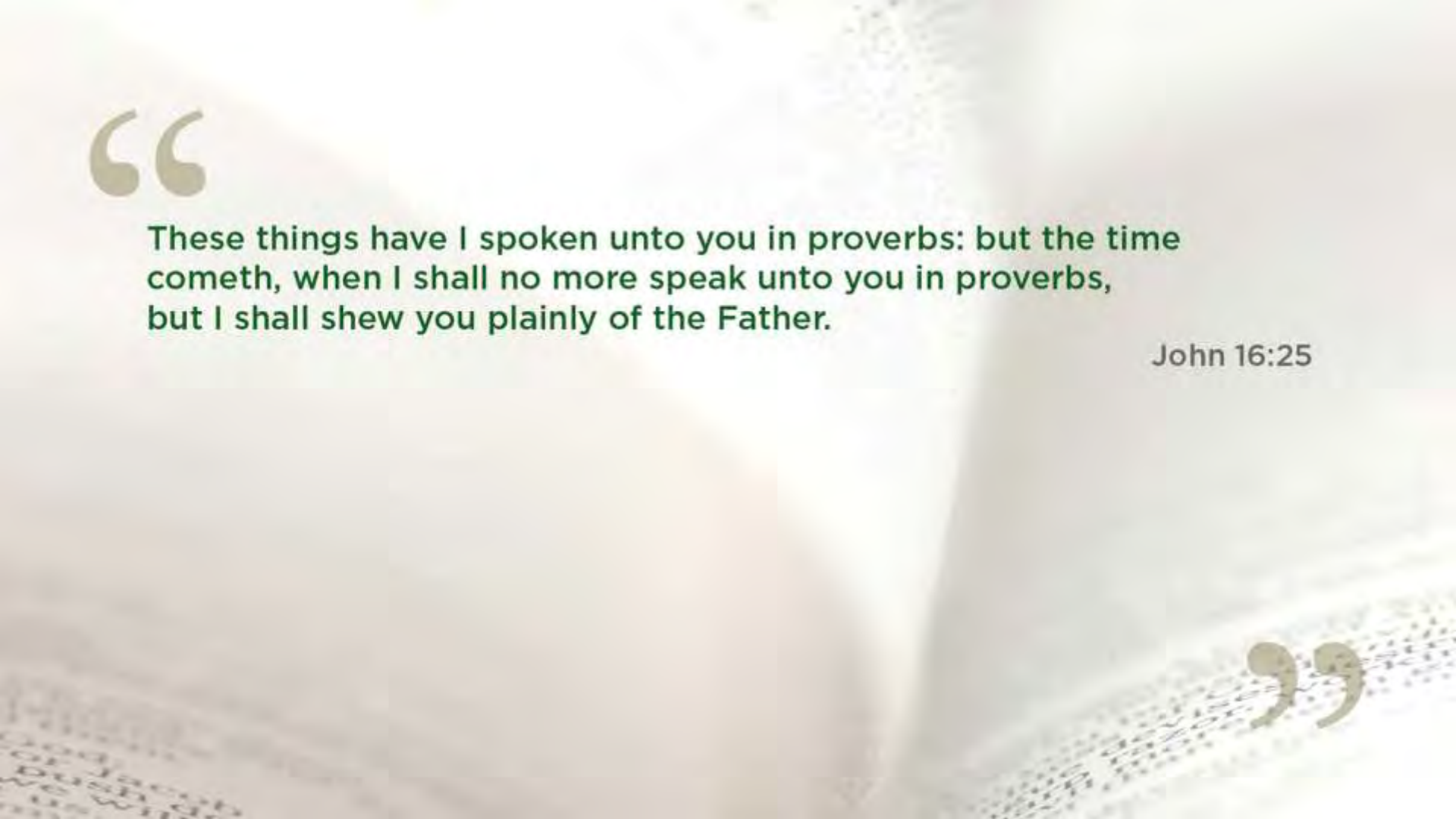

Not that which goeth into the mouth defileth a man.

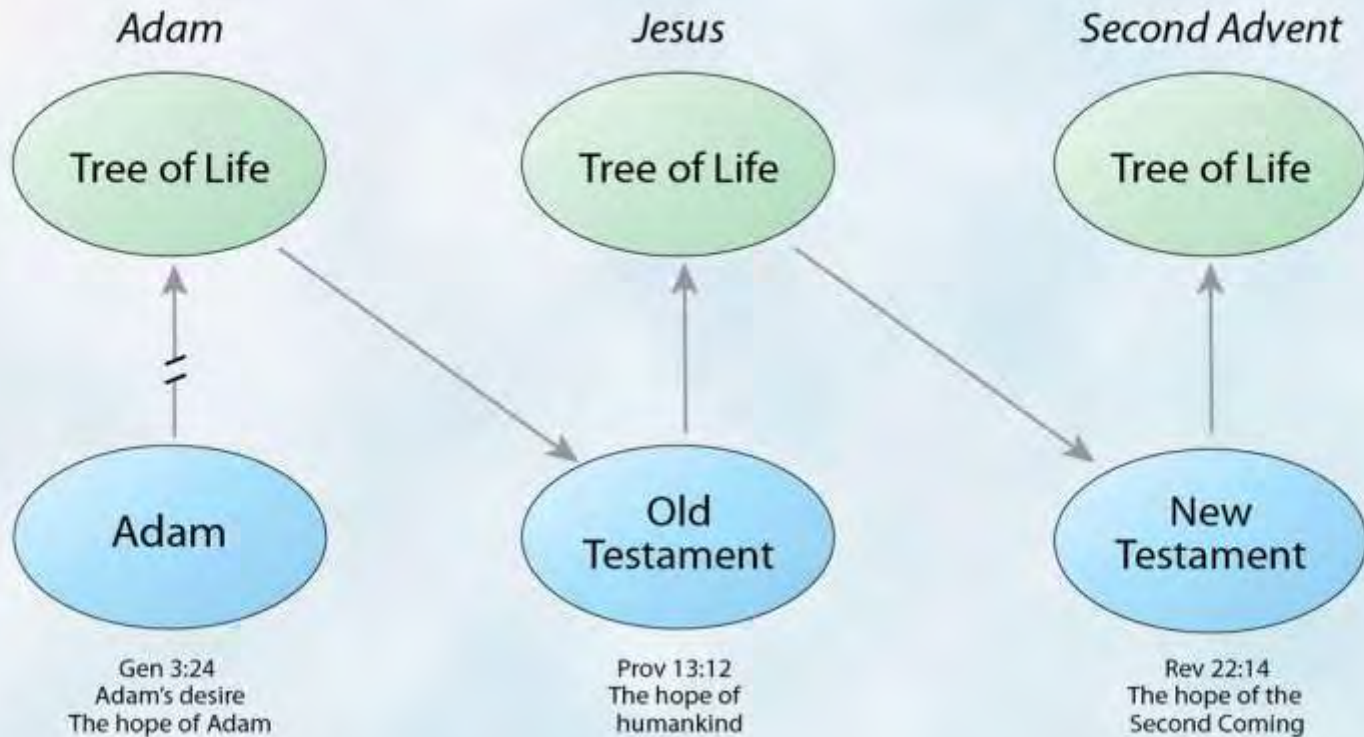

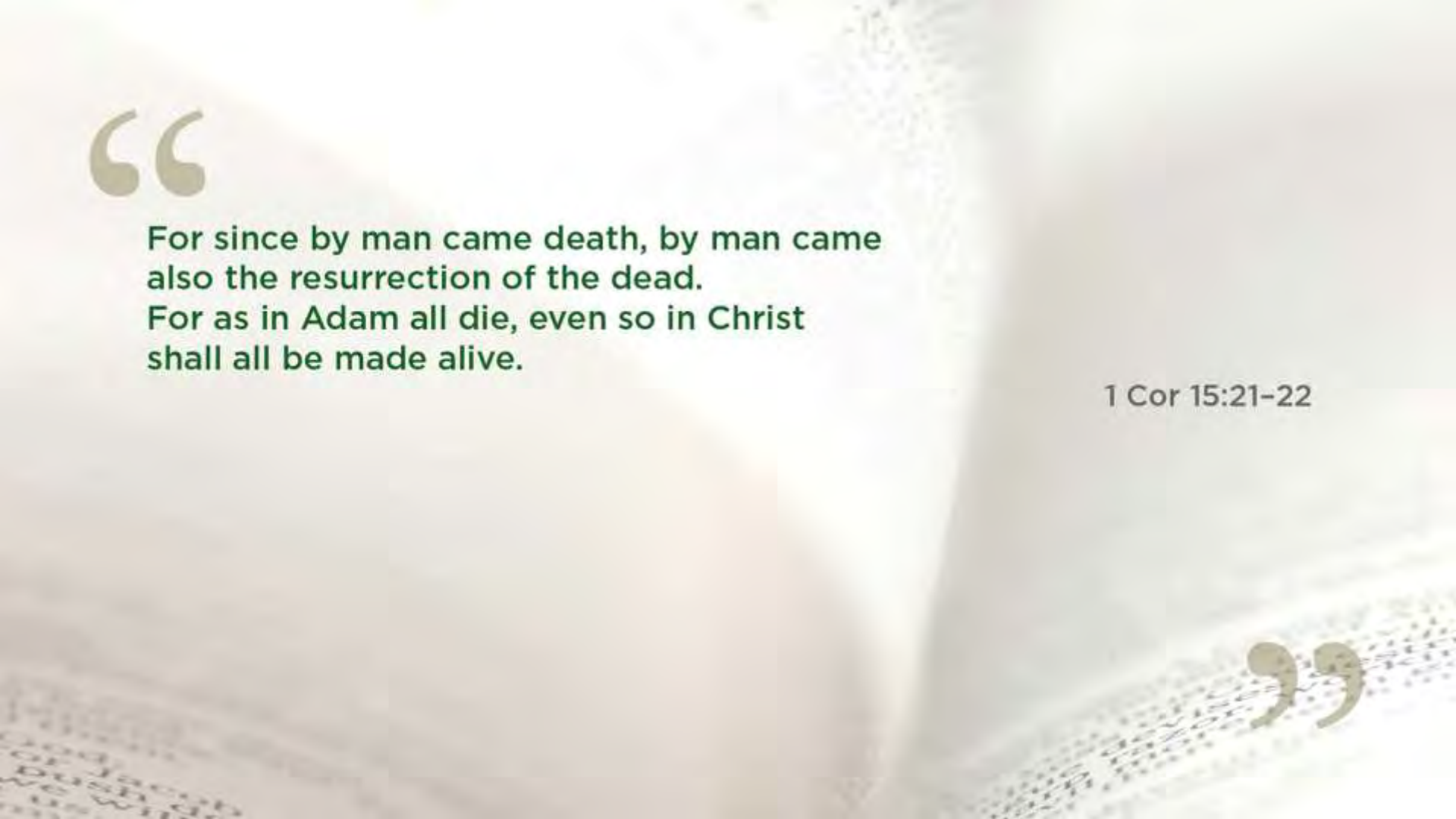

The Tree of Life



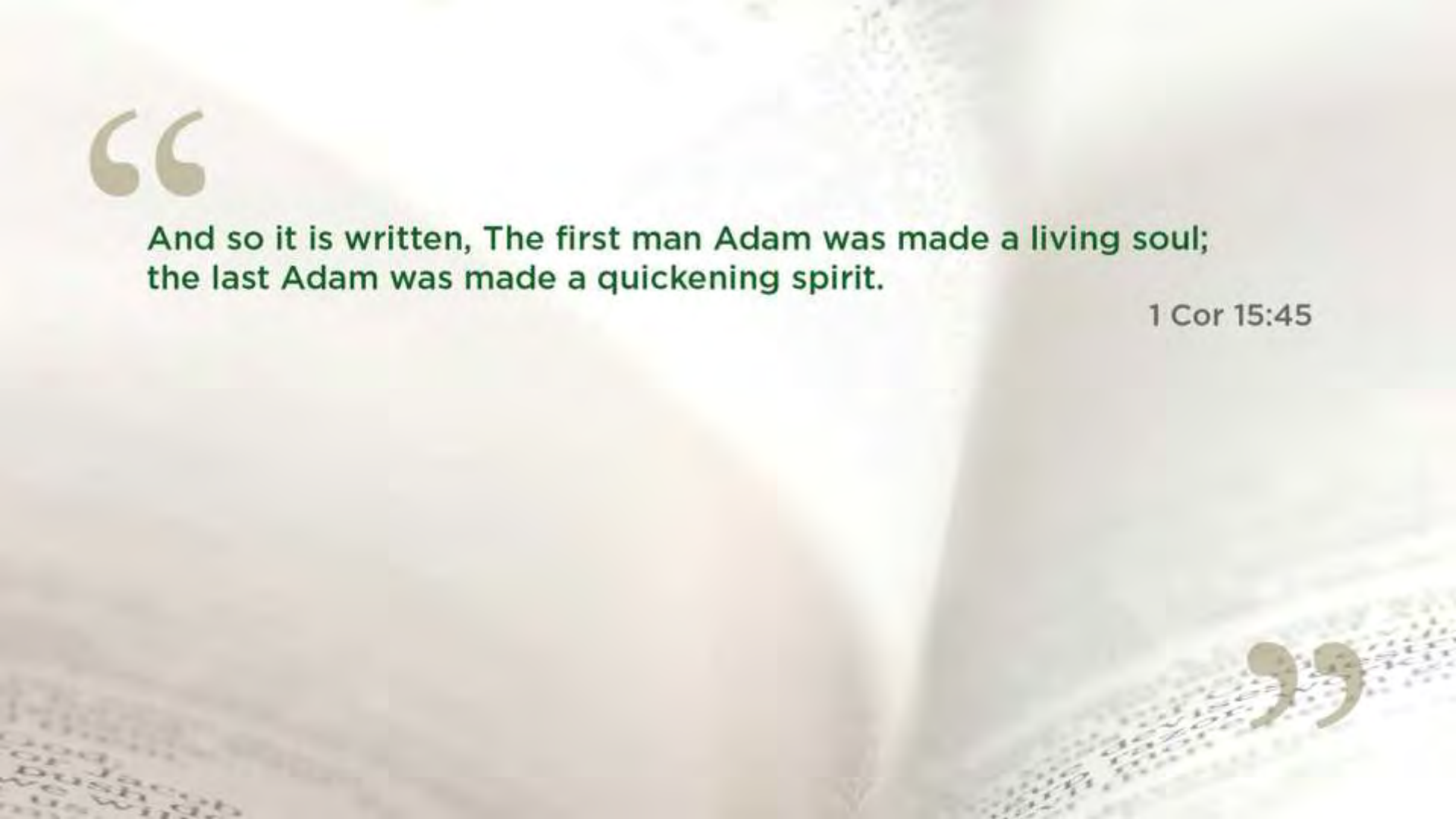

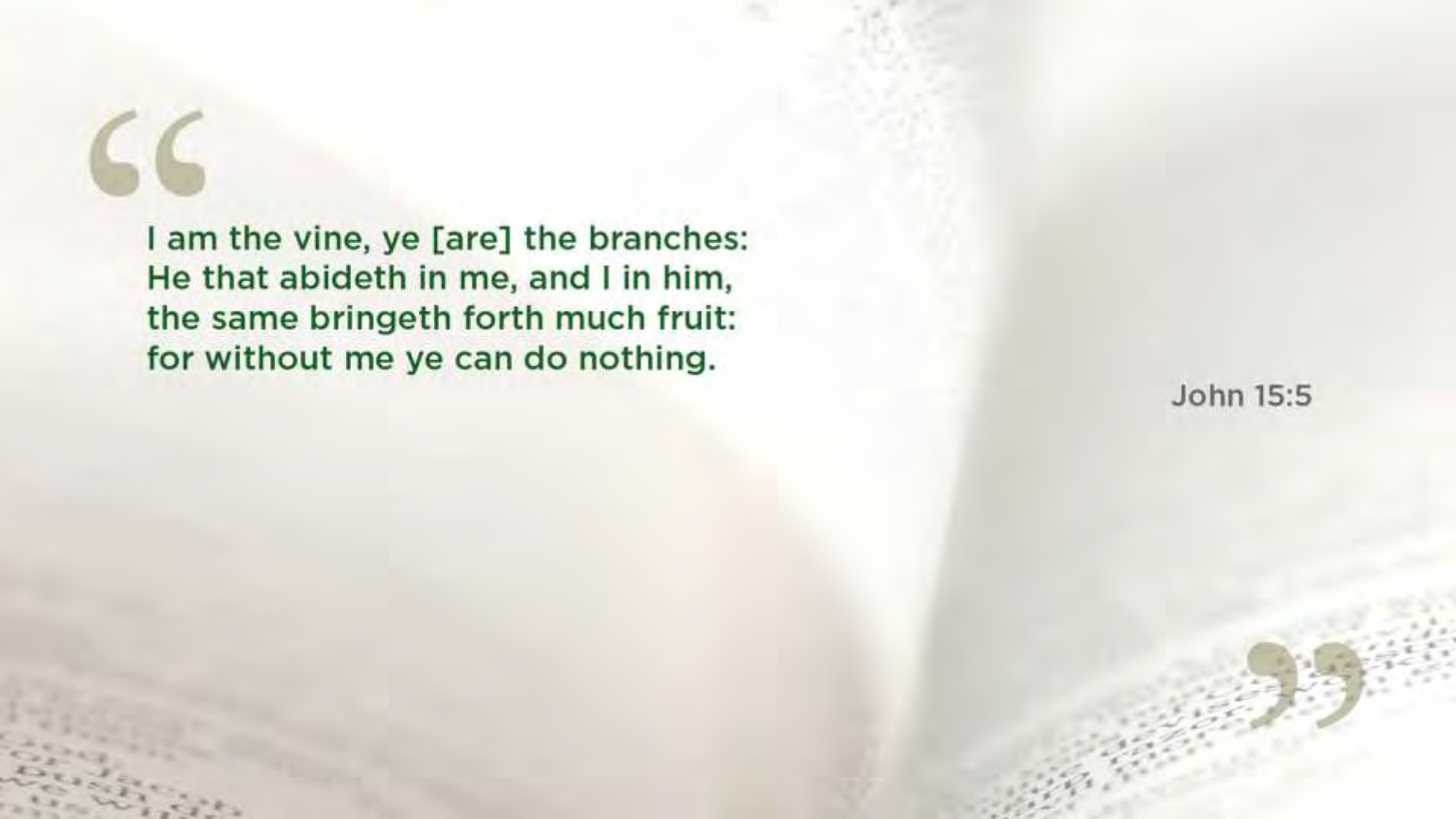

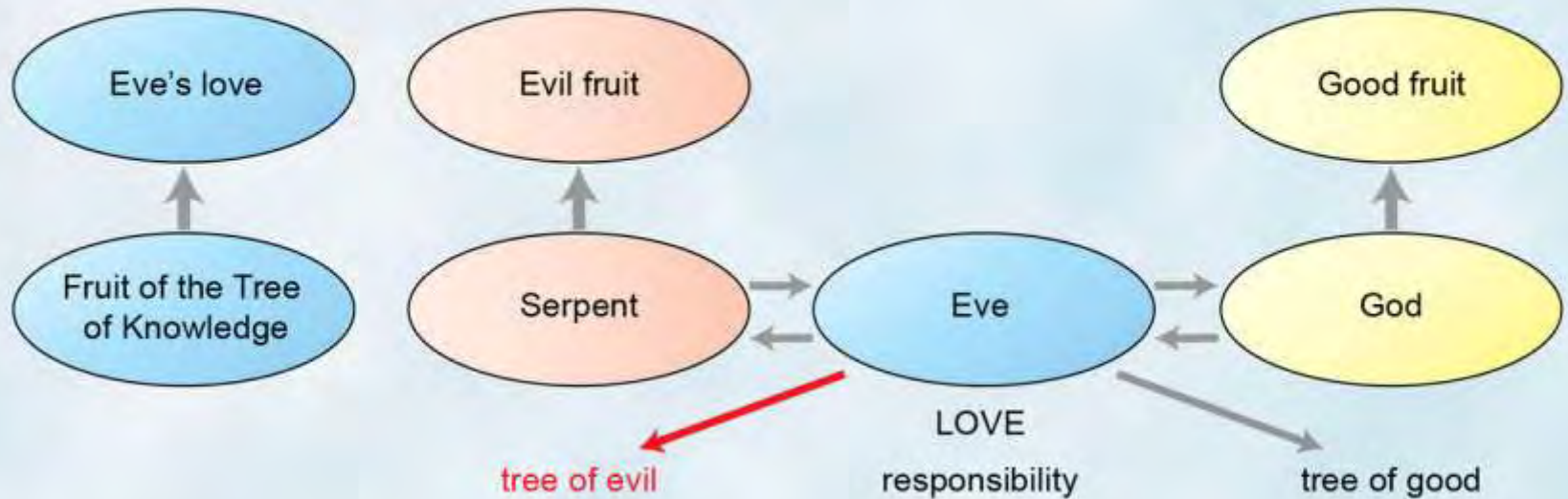
What is the Tree of Life?

- The first Adam fell
- Jesus became the second Adam
- Jesus is the last Adam / the perfected Adam
- The True Olive Tree we're to be grafted onto

What is the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil?

- The Tree of Knowledge is a symbol of Eve.
- If she obeys God's commandment
Eve becomes a Tree of Goodness.
- If she **disobeys** God's commandment
Eve becomes a **Tree of the Knowledge of Evil**.

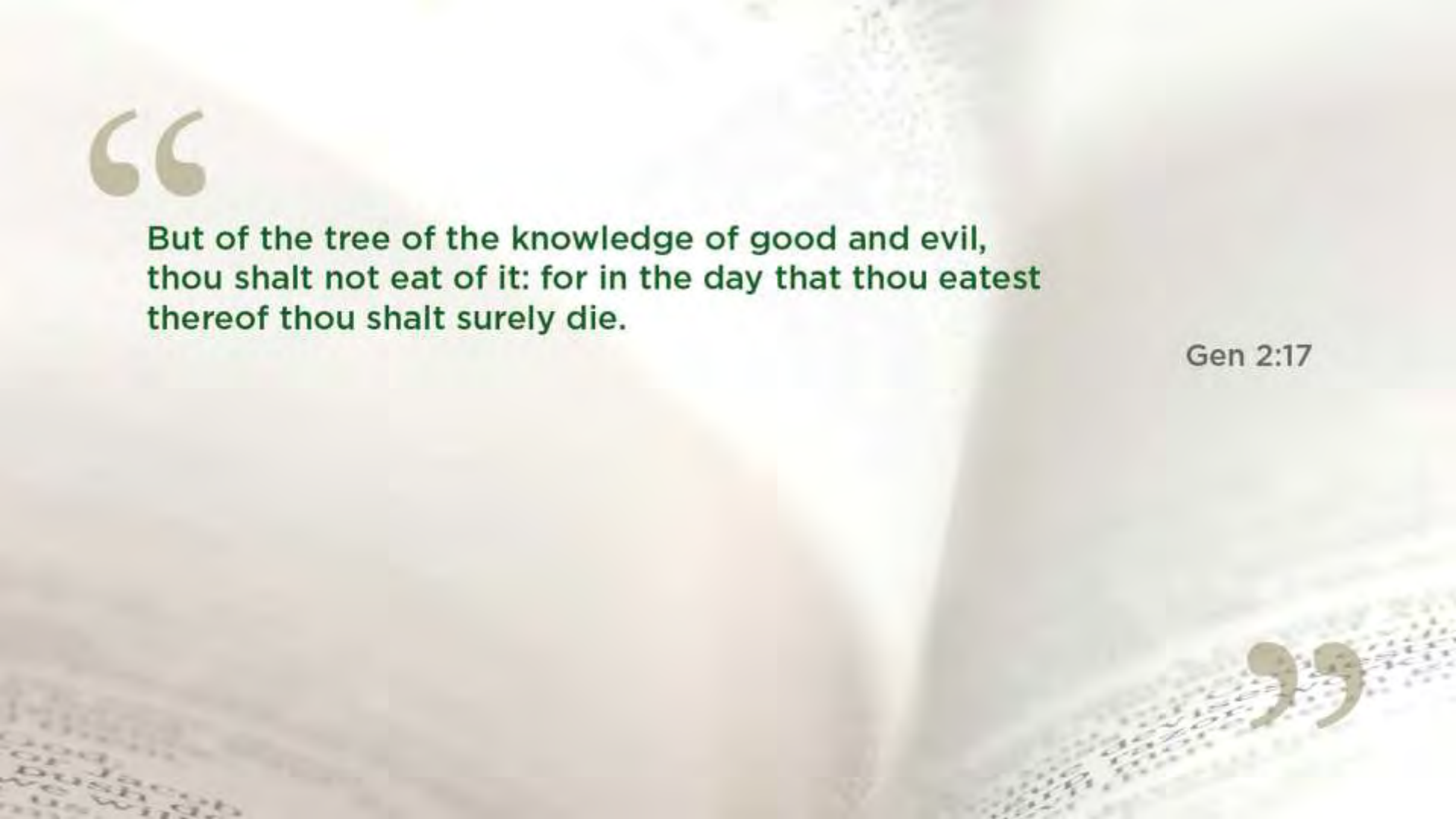

The sin of the angels was **fornication**.

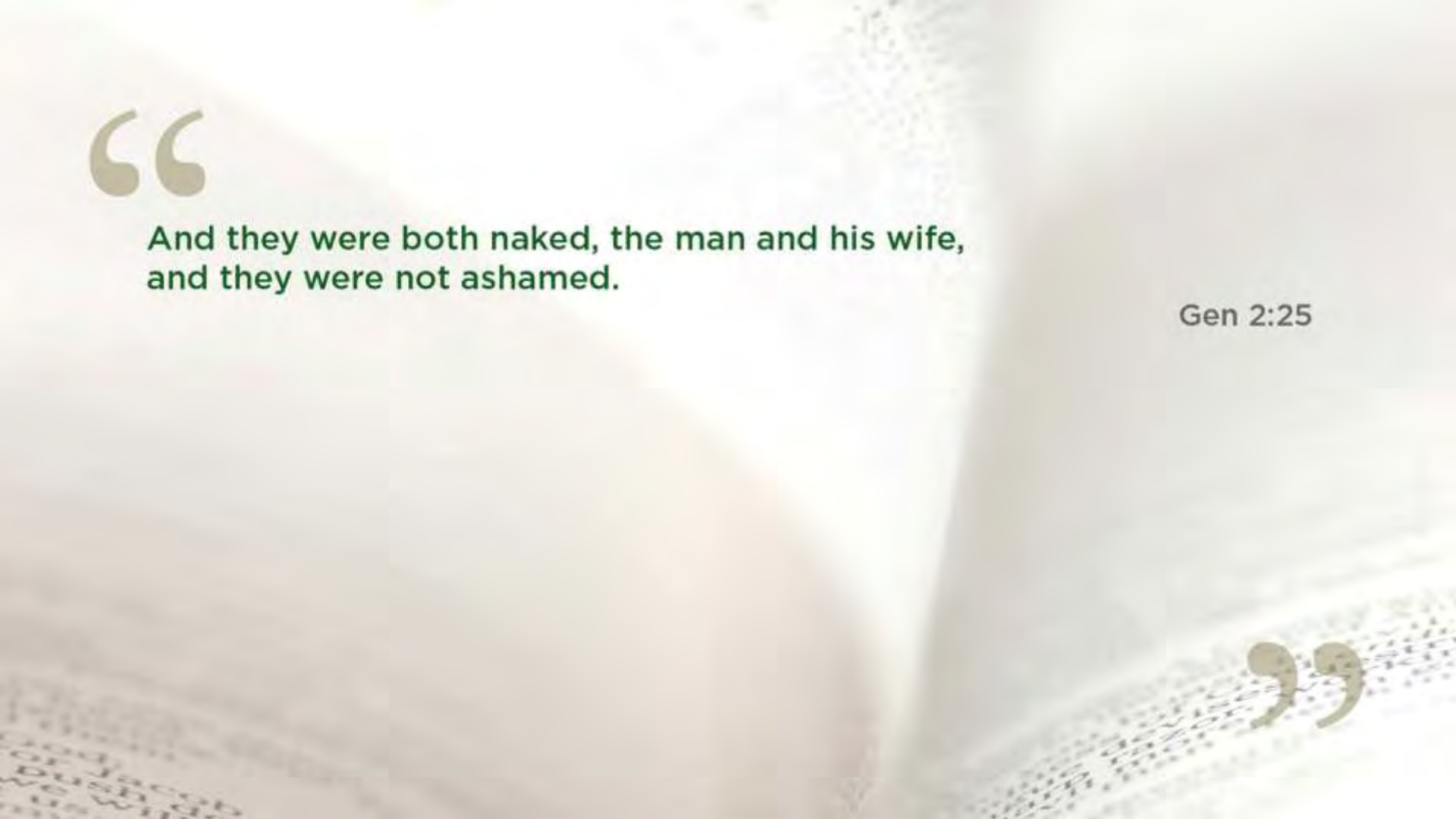

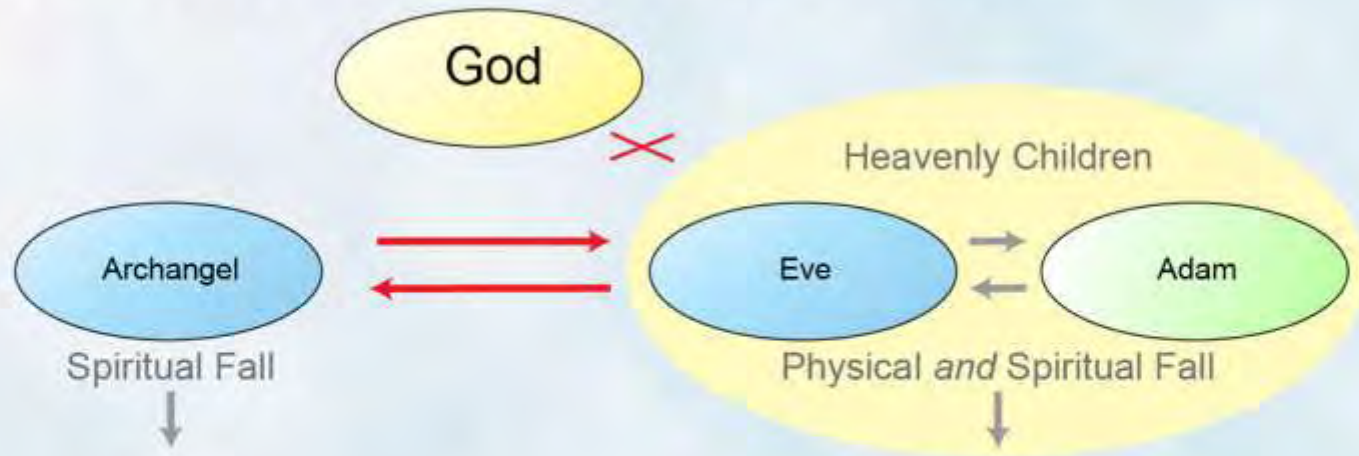

Why did they hide their lower parts?

Why God gave the commandment

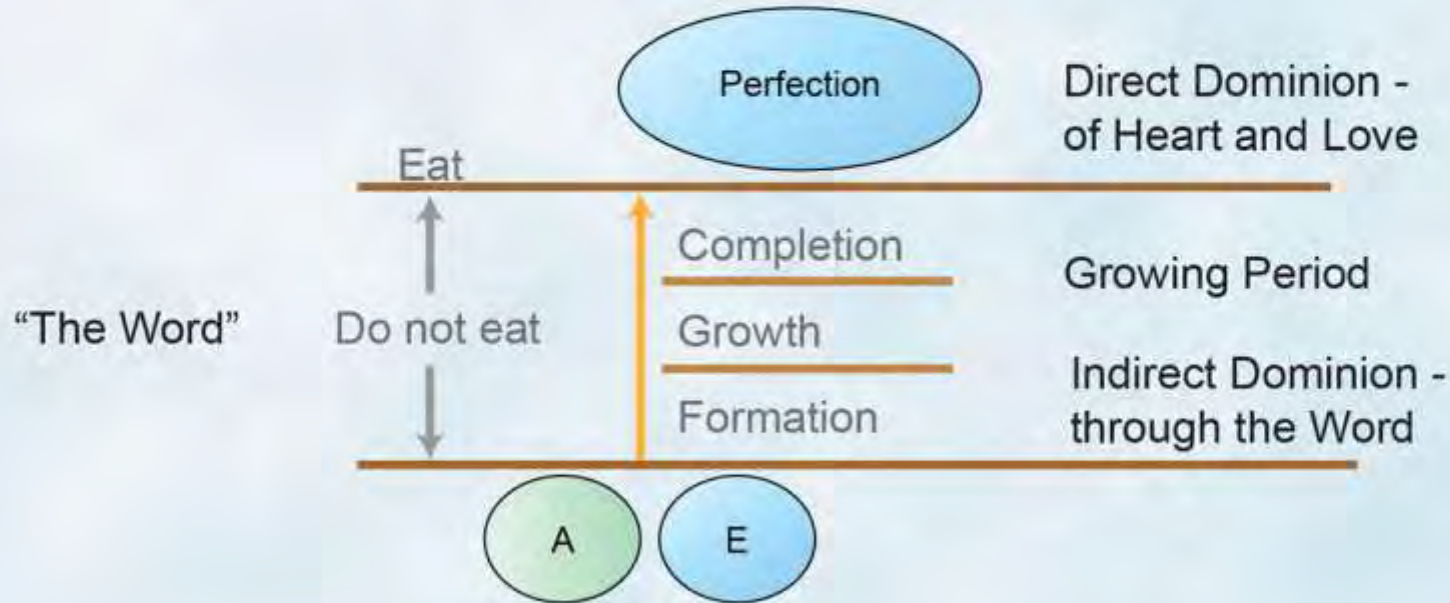
- For Adam and Eve to perfect their character through obedience to the Word.
- To bind them to God alone
- To protect them against the Fall

Why God gave the commandment

In their immature state, God could not govern Adam and Eve directly through love.

Because love is stronger than Principle, God gave the Commandment in order to prevent the Fall.

The Commandment is necessary during the Growing Period only

Satan and Fallen Humanity



Three fundamental changes

- Change of blood lineage
- Change of ownership (God is not the owner)
- Change of the realm of *shimjung*

Our **original mind** tells us to practice the **life of attendance**

The meaning of sin

Sin is a **violation of heavenly law** that is committed when a person forms a **common base with Satan**, thus setting a condition for give and take action with him.

The meaning of sin

- Original sin
- Hereditary sin
- Collective sin
- Individual sin

The **Messiah** comes to **remove the original sin**.
This is the meaning of the Marriage Blessing.

The appearance of fallen nature

Fallen nature is **original nature twisted into evil** by the introduction of selfishness from Satan. We identify four key aspects of fallen nature.

The appearance of fallen nature

- Failure to take God's viewpoint
- Departure from one's natural position
- Reversal of ownership
- Multiplication of evil

Based on this, we see that in restoration
there are **three liberations**.

Three liberations

- Satan's blood lineage: eradication → BLESSING
- Satan's dominion: fallen nature → PRINCIPLE LIFE
- Satan's lifestyle: environment → CHEON IL GUK

Result of these liberations

- Realize the True Family: Ideal World
- Establish God's Homeland

The restoration of love

- God loves His enemy
- Satan is the accuser
- Jesus liberated God from accusation
- We must do the same
- **Restoration comes through natural surrender**

The unfinished restoration

Jesus' own family rejected him, so Satan continued to mock God, saying there will never be any family of God's lineage.

That's why **True Parents liberate God.**

How fallen nature works in us

- It arises when we fail to love as God loves. We then feel resentment over being excluded and unloved.
- It arises when we complain and are dissatisfied with who we are, from a selfish vantage point.
- It gains strength when we dominate or control others based on our own desires and issues.
- It solidifies when we persuade, force or seduce others to go along with us.
