absolute love and absolute obedience. Blessed central families, you must understand that you must fulfill your responsibilities or your descendants will accuse you. Even if we die we shall live on. What good is it to live and not fulfill our responsibility? Do you Christian leaders here (Bishop Stallings, Rev. Edwards, Rev. McGhee, Archbishop and Bishop Delarosa) understand?

We have to think about fulfilling our own mission. America opposed me in the past. At some point in time I had to walk that path. I had to overcome

obstacles one by one. That is the only way I could make progress.

I told God that everyone is falling into hell and I would like to save them. For the first time in human history, God met someone like me. Now you have True Parents who can follow God total-

ly. How can things be resolved? The number of people that follow God is small.

Homosexuality is not the way of heaven. You must understand the ideal of absolute sex, in which one man and one woman bind together forever in fidelity and true love.

[Father spoke in English with profound heart to the young STF people. He spoke about absolute faith, absolute love and absolute obedience. He also spoke about filial piety toward their parents.]

Welcome True Parents

When American people are focused on having fun and just trying to be happy, actually Satan is laughing at them. God is sad and not happy. Happiness comes when we live for the sake of others.

The Abel UN made an incredible foundation.

Now we need new absolute values. Adam and Eve were supposed to be blessed, but they fell. Some people fell and want to be blessed. How many times can you marry? Once!

Many UC members want to be blessed, but they are not spiritually prepared for the Blessing. We should even use the internet. Have you thought about that? We must bless everyone, from the spirit world to the physical world. Archbishop Stallings' ancestors are watching from the spiritual world.

You must go through formation, growth, and completion stages. When we do Tong Bang Kyok Pa we must do it in three stages: neighborhood, precinct, and village. The number 8 is a new beginning. Number 1 represents God, number 2 is Adam, and number 3 is Eve. Seung Hap Ship Seung II. The number 10, 5 plus 5, is the returning number, back to the origin. Ahn Shi II is the holy day of attendance, not Ahn Shik II (Sabbath).

You can go ahead and do something that isn't right, but your ancestors will come after you.

Do you think Rev. Moon will persecuted again? No. I am the parent of Heaven and Earth. All is fulfilled. I cannot be stopped. Bishop Stallings, Rev. Edwards do you understand? Many clergy are spiritually dead. You have to make a revolution. You should be very serious about my words. You cannot live without the knowledge and intellect. My teachings are very logical.

We must liberate all people, including those under communism. Islam, Christianity and Judaism and all religions must fulfill their responsibility. They should not fight. Some take the Koran or the Bible and use it to justify fighting. This should not be done. So far there have been a lot of divisions and struggles within Christianity.

The white sister here with blonde hair: you are from the polar bear race. They descended from the pirates. From England came many pirates. Spain, Portugal and the European countries began with piracy. They are also the ones who spread Protestantism. Italy was also involved with spreading Christianity.

People in the world do not understand how God has been leading the dispensation. In the spirit world, the five major religious leaders have been blessed. They have attended True Parents. As the parents of heaven, earth and humanity, True Parents are human beings who are manifesting the vertical and horizontal axes. We should have absolute faith, absolute love and absolute obedience. The root of this is God.

This is the period after the establishment of heaven. The right hand and the left hand should not be fighting; they should become one. We should bring two hands together. We should be number one in whatever we are doing, whether it is a sports game or any other kind of activity.

From July 20 through August 20, we must make a special effort

to go through three different stages. August 20 is the day when I was liberated from Danbury prison. We should bring liberation on the national and international levels. All people, including orphans in ghetto areas, should be liberated. We should become totally one with the cosmos. Heaven and earth should become one. We must liberate our fatherland and our homeland. We should turn this world upside down through the Blessing. We can become true sons and daughters of filial piety and loyalty through the Blessing. That's how we should live.

Jesus should have become the King of Kings in his lifetime. For that to be done, he should have established the four position foundation. The number 24 is 12 plus 12. Adding 4 to it makes the number 28. We should establish the number 44 and then be able to establish the Kingdom of Heaven on those principled numbers. Five men and five women coming together create the number 10. You must establish the four position foundation and establish the number 12.

There is order in everything. How can a father have a relationship with his own daughters? Is that proper for human beings?

The 38th Parallel is the critical dividing line between North and South. Religious people must not fight but must unite. When they unite, North and South Korea will unite.

What America fears the most is China, because there are many more people in China.

White people should not be proud of yourselves. Eskimos were living centered on fishing, and white people came with guns and took whatever they wanted. Eskimos are related to the Orientals. Many of them were shot and killed by white people.

Columbus proclaimed that he "discovered" America.



The Spanish took many things from the Native American Indians and violated them. This must be restored. The British did even more. They took opium to China and started the opium war to destroy the Chinese.

Some people are afraid that Rev. Moon might conquer the world as an Asian, but my desire is not to conquer the world but to restore the world back to God. People want Communism to

be destroyed, but the question is can we save the communists.

Should white people be blessed? Yes, all people should be blessed.

We should be able to offer our lives for God. Man should cherish the holiness of his love organ. I was tempted by many women in my life. I overcame, and you must do the same. You must be

able to do the things God is pleased with.

Many women tried to tempt me, especially when I was in Japan. I related to all women as my sisters.

Man wanted to have dominion over the creation. Adam was interested in the animals, the butterflies and any animals. He was curious especially about how they shared their love. Eve was interested in something else. The Archangel was very kind and under-

standing and spent time with her. He knew how to please the woman. Adam was off somewhere else.

I met Jesus when I was 16 years old. Jesus could not be married even when he reached 30 years of age. That was not God's original desire.

Eighty percent of white men should marry black women.

What about white women marrying black men? What if everyone only marries their own race—Koreans marrying only Koreans, Hispanics only Hispanics, Russians only Russians? Actually, you should

marry someone of a different race, not just someone of your own background. People of different races should get married and then both backgrounds should live together. Some people may wonder why I promote interracial marriage or international marriage. All people should be from a completely mixed lineage. All nationalities and all races should come together. The different races grew out of the effect of the environment. The climate and the weather affected the characteristics of white people and Asians.

Do you love your wife? Sometimes after 20 years the husband and wife get tired of each other and think about someone else. The only thing

that can prevent trouble is loving each other. Even when you are 60 or 70 years old, you must still invest in and love each other. This keeps the relationship fresh and changing and developing.



am inspired to let you know how beautiful the day of Blessing was. At the stadium not far from Sun Moon University in Asan City (near Cheonan, about an hour's drive south of Seoul), the Blessing of marriage was held on July 26 for thousands of couples. This represents the ifth phase of the 400 million couple 3lessing. The stadium was literally filled with blessed couples of both first and second generation. The brides looked stunning and beautiful in their white oridal gowns, and the men also looked great in stature and dignity, as these amilies pledged they would not only ouild true families with no divorce and no adultery, but also that they would seek to build a new world through linkng their family together beyond race and religion, to build the Kingdom of

Prominent religious leaders representing various faiths of the world came orward to bless the couples. Standing on the stage in a line, each one offered a prayer from their own religious tralition asking God's blessing upon he couples. Archbishop George Augusus Stallings represented Christianty. Imam Muhammad Elahi represented the Shiia Muslim faith. They were joined by Dr. Hamdi Mohamnad Murad, professor at Al Baraga Jniversity, a leader of the Syrian Orthodox Church, a Hindu leader, a Shinto leader, and a Buddhist leader. The invocations of blessing from religious leaders affirm that there is one God and that all the faiths are comng together now to invoke the colective power of their foundations in strengthening and uplifting marriage and family. These two principles

were emphasized in Rev. Chung Hwan Kwak's keynote address – first, faith in God, and second, that the family is the most essential component for bringing love, happiness, and peace into the world.

The gathering included over 300 prestigious participants of the Interreligious and International Federation for World Peace (IIFWP) Assembly 2004 conference, representing 120 nations. Several former presidents, prime ministers and current heads of state joined with top religious leaders not only to observe this blessing of marriage, but also to support the effort to strengthen families through all the religions. Throughout the conference many were interviewed as to their understanding of Father Moon's work and mission. In many different ways the leaders of many of the countries in the world are seeing that Father Moon truly is a leading figure for world peace and the development of strong families, with respect for all races and religions.

Through the increased media atten-

tion to the work of Father and Mother Moon, the key leaders of the world are now looking more deeply into the teaching and the practice of this world peace movement. Also, through the many conferences throughout the world, bonds of friendship are being established that go deeper than just working relations. Truly a global family is emerging of people who have influence in their nations and within their religions to lead the world into a culture of heart and peace.

True Parents opened the WCSF on July 23 in Cheonan with tremendous encouragement to the leaders, saying that they are being called by God to take responsibility to lead this world away from the scourge of war into an era of reconciliation and dialogue through mutual respect and understanding for all people.

The opening session of the weeklong International Peace Sports Festival was held in Asan City in a beautiful ceremony that was likened to a religious Olympics. The athletes paraded into the stadium with the flags of their countries, representing their pride and the best of the religious cultures in their nations. Our American teams have done very well at the games, and I understand we have some gold medals. I'll confirm and let you know, but I know our Washington, DC, basketball team was in the lead the last I checked. The athletes have the broadening experience of competing beyond race and religion on an international basis, where Christians, Muslim, Jews, Buddhists, and other world religious bodies are represented in peaceful but spirited competition. Whether they receive medals or not, participants go home with determination to come back next year to advance their teams' efforts.

At the opening ceremony, Father Moon's major address called for peace through ideal families. In this process he encouraged the athletes, as well as all the dignitaries, to understand that peace is linked essentially to the family. Without families that are stable and loving, there can be no peace.

At the same time the sports fest is going on, the Mr. and Miss University pageant is in progress, where students who represent their nations and their universities have come for a pageant that emphasizes morality and abstinence before marriage and fidelity within marriage. It's a great encouragement to see men and women competing not only based on talent and the gift of good appearance, but also based on moral character and commitment to build a better world.

The Youth Federation for World Peace, led by Rev. Bong Tae Kim, had a beautiful opening session in Seoul on July 24. Many young con-

and weaknesses, and you should know your attitude in life. Especially as leaders, you should fulfill your responsibility.

Now I weigh about 83 kilograms

(186 pounds). I used to weigh 95 kilos. You should learn self defense and always be trained and ready for anything. What is most important is your mentality. With the right mentality you can fulfill anything. You should even be able to sleep with your eyes open!

You should be good in all sports. You should be trained to survive in

all circumstances. All these things are here to give you training. When I go fishing, I can remain in the same spot all day long without moving. When I play baseball I can be a good catcher or pitcher or any position.

I spent 100 days in Korea, and 5 days in Kodiak, I was gone for 105 days.

I want you to take a special leap in your faith at this time. This is the time to give a special Blessing to your relatives and to all of your people. All people of the world should be able to



participate. Now you should be able to restore your neighbors on the myun and gun level (these are the governmental units in Korea below the city level). This probably corresponds to precincts and townships in America.

Three thousand three hundred myuns and guns should be involved. This will cover a certain amount of people. We should involve all Ambassadors for Peace; they should all should be informed and connected. Everyone should be blessed, no one should be left behind. All people should be registered. Chris-

tian leaders should lead the way. Young people should all be involved with the Bless-

This is a powerful mission that you should be involved in. You young people must take Hoon Dok Hae seriously. You should find the way to cover the whole nation with the Blessing. Ambassadors for Peace should be active for this responsibility.

From now, our

prayer should be only reporting results. If we have no results we should not speak. Then with whatever results we offer, God can receive them and guide us regarding the next day. If we have no external results we have to make

internal results and offer them to God. This way we can progress each day. Wherever you go you should bless everyone. Everyone in each nation must be blessed. UC members should not rest. Continuously bless people. You should become the owners of Cheon Il Guk. That's the kind of chil-



dren you should become. For this cause I have shed tears, sweat and blood. With this is in mind, you must fulfill your mission. ❖

gressmen from the Korean National Assembly participated in it and gave speeches. At the same time, World CARP held its international conference from July 22-24 at Sun Moon University, in which Hyun Jin Nim inspired thousands of young leaders to live for the sake of others.

The academic core of this WCSF is the IIFWP Assembly 2004 conference. Rev. Kwak in his opening address on July 23 in Seoul noted that the fall of man set humanity on a course that would not be able to achieve the order and structure of true love. He said, "Among Rev. Moon's most profound spiritual discoveries about God is the realization that God's heart is one that aches with disappointment and loneliness over the loss of His children, and the core and essence of His creation, true love, which was lost by the fall.

"Human society was built on the foundation of impure love within the family of our ancestors. Selfishness became dominant in human relationships. As such, family love was not only easily corrupted by infidelity and abuse but often contributed to ethnocentrism, racism and nationalism. As families multiplied into tribes, nations and civilizations, selfishness manifest-

ed in the injustice, inequality, preferential love, and imbalances of power and wealth on a global scale. For this reason, the purpose of God's providence is to restore the family, and that process begins with religion. Knowing this, Father Moon has always emphasized the central importance of religion and the need for mutual respect and cooperation among religions. Religions are the schools of repair and restoration. They are instruments to lead us to a full, clear relationship with God, untainted by sin, selfishness or impurity, to a state where we would exist without any shadow and with nothing to hide before God, humanity, and the entire spiritual world."

Rev. Kwak went on to say that the family is the primary building block and instrument of peace, and yet also the family is the school of true love, a micro-city or micro-government, a micro-religion, a micro-school and a micro-economic system. Father Moon looked through the family ideal to a vision of universal peace and a realization of the Kingdom of God. That is why he founded IIFWP. Building on the foundation of religion and family, its goal is a world of universal harmo-



ny among all people who would dwell together as citizens of a unified and prosperous world under God. This is the ideal of the peace kingdom.

Rev. Kwak emphasized Father Moon's respect for the UN and also his understanding that it's not easy to change traditions and practices that

would allow for a new paradigm to emerge. He understands it will take time for the UN to further expand and fully utilize the opportunity that religion provides in the path to peace. For this reason, Father Moon founded the IIPC to be a "peace UN" as an institution of global guidance rooted in true love and a world culture of


heart. He concluded by congratulating the leaders on their consistent efforts to try to take the vision of a world culture of heart and make it into reality.

For me this WCSF is very special. We had the opportunity to have Middle East panels and discussions, as well as very well informed, sophisticated discussions on the reunification of North and South Korea from experts from America, Asia, Europe, and all the continents. What's most encouraging is that many who represent the divergent traditions that are in conflict in the world actually show that with the proper atmosphere and commitment, those representatives can come together and create a path to peace that is universal and solid. Now those same leaders are being called from every country of the world

to participate in the World Peace Pilgrimage. At a very exciting luncheon program set up by Dr. Thomas Walsh, the Middle East Peace Initiative committee was highlighted and represented by Dr. Antonio Betancourt, who has been appointed as Secretary General of the World Peace Pilgrimage in the Holy Land and is coordinating not only the visitation of 191 nations to the Holy Land but also the highest possible meetings in the religious and civic areas to forge bonds of peace that will link the world with the Holy Land and support the peace process.

I was given the opportunity to speak, and I could feel the overwhelming response of the participants. Many came up to me afterwards from Belarus, Nigeria, Malaysia, Indonesia, Canada, France, England, Germany, Turkey, and all over the Middle East, saying that they never have seen such hope. They marvel that the whole world is engaging voluntarily in the development of a peace process that respects all religions and races and brings a new understanding of the Kingdom of God.

Rev. Kwak and Dr. Walsh once again have led this conference on behalf of our True Parents with great success. We congratulate them and we are grateful that such a world movement of Ambassadors for Peace is growing in depth and stature.

The Absolute Value System of the True Ideal

This address was given in Cheonan, Korea, July 23, 2004

istinguished guests from 113 nations, leaders from religions, academics, politics, civil organizations, youth participants from the Interreligious Peace Sports Festival, participants of the International Marriage Blessing Ceremony, students and youth leaders, ladies and gentlemen...

The theme and goal of the World Culture and Sports Festival, which I proposed in 1988, is to establish a world culture

of heart. All mankind should come together in harmony and unity centering on God and true love, to create a world of harmonious interdependence, mutual prosperity and universally shared values. Consequently, events of this festival strive to break down man-made walls. This is a cultural festival that aims for a unity transcending nations, races, and religions.

This tenth World Culture and Sports Festival is all the more significant because it comes during a providential time in history when the era of the coming of heaven is so close at hand. In fact, this festival is opening the way for the era of the coming of God's kingdom. The title of this speech is, "The Absolute Value System of the True Ideal Family Determines the Owner of True Love," and it introduces only a part of the truth that heaven has given to mankind.

Dear guests, what was God's purpose in creating humankind? The desire of the omniscient, omnipotent and omnipresent God was to not live in solitude. Thus, He created the cosmos as a part of the process of creating an environment for His children, and on that foundation, He created men and women

as the object of His absolute love.

God created mankind as His children. His desire was for them, His objects, to become better and greater than Himself. Even in this world, parents wish for their children to become better and greater than themselves. This is the love of a parental God, which He gives as a blessing.

God's purpose of creation was to feel joy in seeing His children grow and perfect themselves, receive the marriage blessing from Him, multiply true chil-



dren, and create a true, eternal ideal heaven in which they could live.

The path for becoming an owner of love can be opened through the practice of true love which invests and completely sacrifices itself first for its partner.

Before God created human beings, He first established the standard of absolute faith, absolute love and absolute obedience and then invested Himself 100 percent. Through this, He brought the realm of the object into the realm of absolute values. One cannot become an owner of love on one's own. This is only possible through an object-partner. This love principle of absolute values also pertains to God. Without children, parents can never become owners of love. In the same way, in order for God to stand in the position of the owner of absolute love, He must create His children, who stand as God's objectpartners, in the realm of the values of absolute love. Perfection is reached through the emergence of the values of an absolute subject and absolute object.

Observing the order of the universe, it is not true that the weak are unconditionally sacrificed and exploited for the sake of the strong. The theory of

survival of the fittest and the law of the jungle are fundamentally wrong.

Believers of this theory have overlooked the absolute values that aim for the perfection of the owner of love, who stands as the subject by living for the sake of others, investing true love and forgetting ever having invested into the object, who responds in absolute obedience. If true love is excluded from this formula, only the concept of struggle remains, but God's principle of creating is not that of existence and development through struggle. Rather, He seeks harmony and unity leading to absolute values through a mutual process of giving and receiving within the relationship of subject and object.

An individual may be sacrificed for the sake of the greater good, but we should not perceive this as struggle. It must be seen as an investment for the sake of mutual development.

Can we indeed define the act of an individual willingly sacrificing himself for his family, or the family for the nation, or the nation for the world as struggle? In this way, the realm of absolute values exists for the sake of bringing about the full realization of true love, where each strives to first set up the other in

a position of an owner of true love.

Thus, we must remove from our lives the roots of a self-centered and individualistic mind-set and the behavior that flows from that. This is the root of fallen nature and the cause of all evil. This can be said of self-centered behavior on the individual level as well as of collective individualistic behavior in society.

This path is directly contrary to the spirit of true love's system of absolute values. Instead of sacrificing and giving for the sake of others, self-centeredness calls for others

to sacrifice thereby causing a person to be more concerned with his own interests than the well-being of others. Through the Fall, self-centeredness was ingeniously injected into the mind-body struggle. Satan planted this poisoned mushroom in the hearts of people.

Although embracing self-centeredness may result in a person appearing beautiful and gaining worldly fame and earthly comforts, it is a trap that once entered will lead to addiction and a life of suffering that is difficult to escape.

Let us think about the concepts of "front" and "back." When we say "front" it already acknowledges as a pre-existing condition the word "back." The word "top" holds true only when "bottom" exists; "left" is a precondition of "right."

In the same theory, male denotes the prior existence of female. In other words, men were born for the sake of women, and women were born for the sake of men. Without men, there is no need for women. In the same way, without women, men cannot retain the value of their existence.

In the end, nothing is born for the sake of itself. All beings exist and act for the sake of their partner. This means that we were created to live in an ideal

homeland within the context of relationships of mutual concern for each other.

Let us think about our five sensory organs. Did your eyes come into being for the sake of looking at themselves? Our eyes, nose, ears, mouth and hands all were created for others. What is the force that mobilizes our five sensory organs to sustain our lives and maintain our activities?



FOUNDER'S KEYNOTE ADDRESS

Family Determines the Owner of True Love

It is the force that aims to perfect the values of true love. Therefore, our five sensory organs are simply tools that came into existence for the sake of practicing true love.

In this way, nothing exists for its own sake. A life of living for the sake of others, giving and sacrificing through love, and perfecting the owner of love through obedience, is a life that satisfies God's ideal of creation. You were created for the sake of your partner, therefore the law of nature calls you to live for others more than for yourself. This is where the absolute values of true love are created.

Dear guests, do you know where the dividing line between heaven and hell is? Is it in the air? Is it in a cathedral? Is it in a national boundary? No, the dividing line between heaven and hell can be found in one's sexual organ. The selfish use of human sexuality is where the greatest tragedy in human history occurred; it is a tragedy which turned heaven and earth upside down.

If you recklessly use your sexual organ, like a blind man, you will surely go to hell. On the other hand, if you use it in accordance with the standard

of God's absolute love, you will go to heaven. Who can deny this fact? If you doubt this, I ask you to carefully read the Divine Principle, which contains the laws of heaven that I revealed. If you are still in doubt, I sincerely ask that you pray to heaven. I'm sure that your prayer will be answered.

Ten of thousands of young people in the world who have accepted the teachings of the Rev. Moon have ceased engaging in free sex. The message of the pure love movement, which advocates "absolutely pure sex," or "absolute true love," is now spreading like wild-fire.

If free sex is false love centered on selfish desires and Satan, then absolute sex is absolute love centered on God. Many literary works and stories in the press have the tendency to fan the fires of free sex.

But now, leaders of all spheres of life, including politicians, economists, philosophers, journalists, religious leaders and writers will stand together driving away free sex, a disease that cripples people and nations.

The cornerstone of world peace was supposed to be within Adam's family, which was to create the absolute values of true love. It was also Adam's family that could destroy the path to world peace. Thus, we must bear in mind the importance of Adam's family, the ancestral family of humanity.

The reason I brought an end to our "church" and established the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification is because the time had come to focus on the family.

How can we transform this world, which has become hell-like? The prac-



tice of true love is the only way of finding the absolute values. Since the attributes of God, the owner of true love, are based on eternal, unchanging, unique, and absolute standards, we must also inherit them and live according to those standards.

Dear guests, why is the family a good thing? It is because the family becomes the basis for our activities based on our original freedom, centered on the love of parents. Even though they may be shabby in appearance, when a family becomes an original family, consisting of people bonded in heart with true love at the core, humankind and even God will feel liberated. Freedom without love is not true freedom.

If you feel restrained when you go to someone's house as a guest, it means you still lack a deep bond of love with that household. In other words, because your love does not spread out in all directions you feel awkward and restrained

Then what is the highest and greatest value in the original family? It is the original parent. Why is the original parent good? Because the original parent is the subject of eternal love. The original parents are the ones who stand closest to us in creating a relationship that lasts throughout our lives and beyond.

After birth, the first partner to whom we relate our joy to is our original parent. Thus the original parent is both the subject and object of our joy. The original parents are such that when we are happy, they are the first to be happy for us. When we are sad, they are the first to shed tears of sorrow. Thus, children without parents are called orphans,

and orphans are treated with pity.

Next, one's beloved husband or wife is the second most valuable being in the family. Husbands and wives must be couples that can give and receive original love that is unconditional in nature.

Although this love may not have started within the relationship of love that is absolute and eternal in nature, if it becomes an original love created within the husband-wife partnership, based on the absolute bond between a couple, then that love will become the basis upon which the eternal happiness and joy of the family exists.

But if this ideal, original relationship between husband and wife stops there, existing only between the couple, then it will not bring eternal happiness and joy that hold an absolute value. That is to say, this couple must have their own children. If a couple decides not to have children, thinking that they will live in happiness as a childless couple, you will see the result. Humankind would die out before the second generation. Only when a couple receives the love that the original children return, can they rise up to the position of the original parents as true couples.

Therefore, the next most valuable and important thing is the love of the children toward their original parent. If the children can sacrifice and love the original parent with a bright and positive mind-set, while longing for the ideal environment, not despairing, but hoping for the future, then that love has a pure and genuine value because it exists for the sake of the family's happiness. In this way, an original family

extending over three generations, completely endowed with the sacrificial, original love of original parents toward their children, the true love between the original couple, and the true love of the original children toward their parents will become the most ideal true family in the world.

What kind of person is called a happy person? In other words, what standard is used to measure happiness? Can a person be called happy due to the fact that he has external talent or authority that no other person possesses? Can a person be happy just because he has tremendous wealth that draws the envy of all? Is happiness obtained by becoming a world-renowned scholar and rising to a position which everybody envies? That is absolutely not the

No external condition alone can guarantee a man's happiness for eternity. It may be a reason for searching for happiness, but it cannot become happiness itself. In the end, genuine happiness comes from a family that has loving parents, a couple bond-

ed in true love, and children that are devoted and faithful to their parents.

Distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen, humanity will now witness a great revolution of true love that is taking place on the Korean peninsula. Humanity, which has struggled under the false love of Satan for thousands of years, will now hear a cry of joy upon establishing the absolute values of the true family and ridding this land of all sorts of false values.

Two hands must come together in order to make a clapping sound. Heaven has already opened the gates of the "era after the coming of heaven" on the foundation of the victories of Rev. and Mrs. Moon, the True Parents. Our responsibility is to become the absolute object partner before Heaven, the subject partner, and open the way for the age of the creation of a new heaven and earth. This is an historical age where spirit world and physical world are united as one and when Cheon Il Guk (Cosmic Kingdom of Peace and Unity), the peace kingdom that God had envisioned from the beginning of time, is being established on this earth and in heaven. The time has come for intellectuals the world over to receive the teachings of Rev. Moon, who has served God as the vertical axis of humanity and upheld his mission as the horizontal True Parents. This has been done throughout his eighty-five years of life, consistently sacrificing and serving, in order to discover and to establish a true person, true couple, true parent, true family, and true world. May I ask all of you to please join me in completing this historical task for the sake of heaven? ❖

World CARP at WCSF

lecture in "Building Alignment to the Vertical Axial Line" was presented by Young-Jun Kim, the Vice President of Human Resource Development in WCARP, at 11:30 in the morning of July 22, 2004. The purpose of the lecture is to grasp

an overall picture of Hyun Jin Nim's core teachings of the last five years and to recognize our responsibility in this time of age and determine to fulfill it. The Flow of the presentation was centered on the two key words, "Vertical Axial Line" and "Alignment."

The first half of the lecture focused on presenting "Vertical Axial Line." He presented the meaning and significance of the Vertical Axial Line, and its relationship to the commencement of the set-

tlement age. In this presentation, the Vertical Axial Line, having the characteristics of oneness and uniqueness, was defined as the Three generations of God's original family: God, True Parents, and True Family. The Vertical Axial Line is very significant because it is the center of God's providence. Establishing it is God's original dream and the purpose of creation.



IPSF Works at the De-Militarized Zone **Between North and South Korea**

art of the Interreligious Peace Sports Festival educational program was a service project at the De-Militarized Zone (DMZ) between North and South Korea. Untouched for over 50 years after the war, the De-Militarized Zone has become a symbol of harmony because it is home to hundreds of species of plants and animals that have been living together in peace.

Sixty fortunate athletes, including myself, were chosen to participate in the one-day educational tour/service project on July 27, 2004. After a fourhour bus ride and a short stop at the ticket office, we entered the DMZ. Our first stop was the train station, which had photos and artistic impressions of the aftermath of the war in the area, with some brief history behind them. Everyone was snapping photos of everything. Even the soldier on duty was not spared.

We were later taken to the underground tunnels that the North Korean army had dug during the war. The passageways were only discovered by

accident during restoration of the area after the war. All of us got the opportunity to walk through one of the tunnels. Four hundred meters deep and more than 2km long, it became colder the deeper we went. As we walked through the tunnel, there were signboards that explained how coal was painted onto the walls of the passages so as to disguise it as an ordinary coal mine. There were yellow paint marks indicating holes that the diggers made in walls for inserting

dynamite and blasting the wall away. For thirsty travelers, natural spring water was available through a tap that was connected to bowls that collected the natural water dripping from the tunnel ceilings. Going back up was not easy, as everyone had to stop and catch their breath at places where seats were

It was not until we got to one of the observation towers that we had a better view of the DMZ area. A South Korean Army sergeant explained to us the



various places of interest as we looked through the huge glass windows that gave us an almost bird's eye view of the beautiful area. After the short briefing, participants got to look through telescopes to see the places that we were told about. However, no one was allowed to take pictures beyond the observation tower.

A short distance away, we were driven to a home-like restaurant where we had lunch. The food tasted so delicious because the ingredients were freshly

picked from the nearby farmlands. Bowls were refilled over and over again, so everyone left the restaurant with a full stom-

The last part of the program was the service project. We were given gloves and sickles. Our task was to clear the overgrown land of weeds that had grown high and spread wide. One of the participants, Mr. Kenny Holiday, started humming a tune, and one by one we started humming our own tunes. The hot sun took a lot out of everyone, but by the end of the

work, we were treated to a refreshing drink and ice cream. Some of the athletes from Singapore went to the nearby river to refresh themselves. The cool and fresh river water was re-energiz-

Although it was not what most of us expected, the trip to the DMZ was fun and educational. Everyone, especially those who have never experienced anything like this, will remember this for many years to come. ❖

The Tenth World Culture

This address was given in Seoul, Korea, on July 24, 2004

istinguished delegates from 120 nations. Leaders from the religions, the nations, civil society, academia, the arts and sports. Ladies and gentlemen. On behalf of the Founders of the World Culture and Sports Festival, Rev. and Mrs. Sun Myung Moon, welcome to Assembly 2004, sponsored by the Interreligious and International Federation for World Peace and the recentlylaunched Interreligious and International Peace Council.

The 10th World Culture and Sports Festival marks a significant milestone in the history of this global festival dedicated to peace. The WCSF

was founded in 1988 at the time of the Seoul Summer Olympics, and was first convened four years later in 1992. The core purpose of WCSF is the establishment of a "world culture of heart." That is, its purpose is to contribute to a global transformation of the minds, hearts and behaviors of people of all races, religions and nationalities, and to create a world in which human relationships are characterized by true love, harmony, and co-prosperity.

When the Olympics came to Korea in 1988, Rev. Moon affirmed the Olympic ideal of promoting world peace through athletic competition among people of diverse nations. As people of diverse backgrounds interact centering on sports, they can draw closer together and overcome barriers.

However, Rev. Moon wanted to expand this ideal in several important ways. First of all, he identified God as the center point of the human family. By centering on God, all people are better able to transcend or go beyond their own limited perspectives, and see others as their brothers and sisters under God. By humbling ourselves before God's infinite goodness, knowledge and power, each one of us is also better able to recognize the limitations in our own character, perspective, and worldly attachments.

Secondly, he understood that true global peace has its foundation in the family. Peace in the family has its foundation in a God-centered marriage. A man and woman in marriage represent the coming together in love of the masculine and feminine dimensions of the cosmos. In turn, the loving, creative harmony between husband and wife naturally gives rise to parenthood and parental love. Knowing the central and sacred value of marriage and family, he integrated into the WCSF a public marriage Blessing ceremony: the World Peace Blessing.



Thirdly, he brought together leaders from all fields, including religion, government, civil society, academia, and the arts to meet and collaborate in seeking constructive solutions to critical global problems. This component of the WCSF has come to be carried out through the IIFWP Assemblies.

This Assembly for world peace is the 6th in a series that began with the Inaugural Assembly in 1999. In six short years, the IIFWP Assembly series has become a premier international and interreligious gathering dedicated to peace. At this year's Assembly we will consider the theme, "Establishing a World Culture of Heart: Innovative Approaches to Peace in a Changing World."

The best way to understand this theme is to consider and reflect on the spiritual and historical foundations of the IIFWP. As human beings who live in this historical world, we each know that we always are standing at some specific and limited point in time and place. And so, it is helpful for us to have a map that helps identify our location. You may think of these words that follow as a kind of providential map that will allow us to locate our position in the cosmic order.

The ultimate standard and point of orientation of our being in this world, God's essence is true love. As he puts

like a north star, is God. The context for our existence is the cosmos and world He has created. God is the source and foundation for all that exists. Our concept of God is of profound significance for our entire worldview, including the way we view all people and all materials things in the world around us. A narrow, partial or limited view of God, leads to a narrow, partial or limited worldview. The important point is not only THAT we believe in God, but rather HOW we believe in God. Our understanding of God is absolutely essential.

In light of this point, our understanding of the primary characteristics or attributes of God is also of great significance. It makes all the difference if we associate God primarily with such attributes as power, control, and judgment, as distinct from attributes of love, parental care, and compassion. It makes all the difference if we view God as satisfied, remote and distant, or as near, seeking love and relationships, and therefore deeply affected by the selfishness, suffering and evil in our world. Also, it makes all the difference whether we understand God primarily as a being who wants to receive or a being who wants to give.

Rev. Moon has always taught that

it, "God always gives and forgets, gives and forgets....." In creating the world, God had infinite hope for the successful growth and development of Adam and Eve. Through them, He longed to multiply His true love and the joy it could produce. The chief characteristic of true love is unselfishness and living for the sake of others. This is God's essence.

True love, however, is not random and unstructured. It has a precise order and structure to it, just as the universe has order and structure underlying its beauty and function. The order of true love is linked to the harmony of man and woman in marriage, and parents and children in the family. God envisioned the family as the repository of the most precious gift he could offer, namely, true love. This was God's gift to Adam and Eve. It is precisely this gift of true love that Adam and Eve were to have inherited by fulfilling their own portion of responsibility. That is, they would have inherited true love if they had each followed their conscience and practiced faithful obedience to God's guidance as they grew to matu-

The tragedy of the Fall was brought about by the failure of Adam and Eve to observe the laws of love. In this way they undermined the order and struc-

ture of true love.

Among Rev. Moon's most profound, spiritual discoveries about God, is the realization that God's heart is one that aches with disappointment and loneliness over the loss of His children, and the core and essence of His creation, true love, which were subverted and lost by the Fall.

Human society was built on the foundation of impure love within the family of our ancestors. Selfishness became dominant in human relationships. As such, family

love was not only easily corrupted by infidelity and abuse, but family love often contributed to racism, ethnocentrism, and nationalism. As various families multiplied into tribes, nations and civilizations, selfishness manifested itself in injustice, inequality, preferential love, and imbalances of power and wealth on a global scale.

For this reason, the purpose of God's providence is to restore the family. This process begins with religion.

Religion came into being as a needed tool to repair the corrupted heart of human beings. Imperfect love within the family reproduces itself, and creates a culture of selfishness that multiplies and expands from the family, to the tribe, the society, the nation and the world. Religions exist to guide each of us to follow our original mind and to learn the way of true love. Religions are there to lead us to God, our true center, so that we may eventually restore our true character of goodness.

Knowing this, Rev. Moon has always emphasized the central importance of religion and the need for mutual respect and cooperation among religions. Religion is a school of repair and restoration. Religions are not our ultimate destiny. They are not eternal institutions. Rather, they are instruments to lead us to a full, clear relationship with God, untainted by sin, selfishness or impurity; to a state where we would exist without any shadow and with nothing to hide before God, humanity, and the entire spiritual world.

According to God's ideal, human beings would graduate from religion in much the same way as we graduate from a university. That is, we would dedicate ourselves to our courses and pass our exams and receive our diploma, moving on to a full, loving, intoxicating relationship with God, our Father.

Our graduation from religion occurs not through perfection of knowledge or ritual, but as we perfect our character. In the eternal spiritual world we are not appreciated for our religious background or knowledge of doctrine, but for the quality of our character, and especially our heart.

This graduation then provides the basis for our entering into marriage, where we practice living for the sake of others on the most personal and intimate of levels, in the relationship of a husband and wife. Through conjugal love a deep and permanent union is formed, and, as we know, children are born. The family is none other than the school of love, the place where love is experienced and learned by spouses, children, parents and siblings.

In this sense, the family, according to God's original purpose of creation, is a higher expression of God's ideal than religion itself. It is closer to God's original ideal. For God did not originally prescribe a series of rituals, scriptures or houses of worship. He originally created a man and woman in the beauty of creation. He created a couple that was to come to embody God's ideal of love and produce children and multiply true love.

This helps us understand Rev. Moon's own methodology as he works to establish a world culture of heart. For, he initially created a religious organization, one which affirmed the value of the mission and purpose of all religions and which aimed at bringing religions into cooperative and respectful rela-

tionship with one another. He understood that not only faithful adherence to truth, but also interreligious respect and cooperation are necessary if each religion, and each one of us, is to effectively fulfill our mission. For this reason, he initiated the Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity in 1954. In fact, just a little over two months ago, on May 1, we celebrated the 50th anniversary of its founding.

However, in 1996, Rev. Moon officially closed the HSAUWC and replaced it with the Family Federation for World Peace and Unification, with a mission centering on God's ideal of the

family as the core institution for the realization of true love. The Family Federation era represented a shift in providential focus from religion to family, underscoring the truth that the Godcentered family is the essence, mission and end toward which religion moves.

The family is the primary building block and instrument of peace. In the family we harmonize male and female, parent and child, elder and younger, past and future, individual and society, law and love. All the basic requirements for peace have their basis in the family of true love. The family is a microsociety, a micro-government, a microreligion, a micro-school, and a microeconomic system.

Father Moon also looked through the family ideal to a vision of universal peace, and the realization of the Kingdom of God. Thus, in 1999, on the foundation of decades of effort in promoting peace through a wide range of organizations and federations, Rev. Moon initiated the IIFWP, as the premier global institution to promote world peace. Building on the foundations of religion and the family, its goal is a world of universal harmony among all people, who would dwell together in a unified kingdom as citizens of one world of true love and co-prosperity under God. This is the ideal of the Peace Kingdom.

When Father Moon established the IIFWP, he provided its motto: The Hope of All Ages is a Unified World of Peace.

As he expressed it in his speech at the United Nations in August of 2000, one of the core objectives of the IIFWP mission has been to promote the establishment of an interreligious council within the United Nations. He also strongly urged the United Nations to appreciate more fully the significance



of marriage and family. Both religion and the family are essential to the establishment of world peace.

Rev. Moon understands that it is not easy for either the United Nations or many of its member states to change traditions and practices that have evolved over decades and centuries. He realizes that it will take time for the UN to implement innovative proposals.

For this reason, and because the world is in such urgent need for an institution that provides leadership, vision and sacrificial commitment, he launched the Interreligious and International Peace Council on October 3, 2003. As he put it, the IIPC is to be a "Peace UN," an institution of global governance based on true love and rooted in a world culture of heart.

Our theme at this Assembly not only considers the "world culture of heart," but also "innovative approaches to peace in a changing world." Innovation, we all know, is both necessary and inevitable. We are living at a time of transformation, most visibly in the realms of technology, communications and business. Globalization, for example, is a dramatic innovation, as is the rise of NGOs, as well as new expressions of spirituality. This trend will not subside, but will only intensify. Old structures and systems will be challenged relentlessly.

The IIFWP has launched the IIPC as an innovative approach to peace, a council of responsible governance and service that seeks to integrate dimensions of the human social order that have been historically divided; for example, the spiritual and the secular, the governmental and non-governmental, international business and humanitarian idealism, left-wing ideals of justice and right wing ideals of freedom,

traditional values and modern technology, scientific rationality and spiritual wisdom, private morality and public ethics.

Some of you may consider such a goal as either illogical or impossible, or both. However, this list is not intended to ignore logic or reality. These alternatives are not irreconcilable. To borrow a term from Western logic, they are themselves false dichotomies. Within the logic of love, and most importantly the logic of family love, we can find the way for reconciliation.

I hope that during this conference you will come to better appreciate the genius of Father Moon and his profound contribution

to peace. He is no ordinary man, and the movement he has given birth to and raised up over the past 85 years is no "flash in the pan."

Historical changes often emerge in surprising ways. Some of the world's greatest changes have occurred through the invention of a lonely scientist working in a lab, or a searcher alone in the desert seeking truth. It has not been easy for the world to recognize Rev. Moon's contribution to history. But, as I said earlier, what he has taught and accomplished represents an innovation and a contribution that is what the world needs at this time. We are fortunate to be among those who have met him and have heard so directly what he teaches. If we apply these teachings and create institutions that give full expression to them, we will indeed transform the world. We can create a world culture of heart. We can change this world. It begins with each of us. It expands to each of our families, to our places of work, of worship and citizenship.

Please take the opportunity that lies before us with utmost seriousness and hope. Let us create a place here where God's love, wisdom and heart can fuse with His sons and daughters, as we seek Him and seek humbly to express all the goodness and creativity that He longs for us to inherit and enjoy.

I hope that we will each help one another become new and truer people of goodness and true love. •

world-famous Dead Sea. You will have the opportunity to bathe in the mud that is found there. It is world-renowned for its healing and medicinal powers promoting the rejuvenation of your body and spirit. 

History is unfolding before our eyes. I recently had the privilege of visiting our American Clergy Leadership Conference (ACLC) leaders in Texas.

The Rev. Dr. Bennit Hayes met the movement in an unusual way. Rev. Charles Keyes, an ACLC pastor, was accompanying another pastor to a revival two years ago at the Gloryland Baptist Church in Houston. When Rev. Keyes walked in, Rev. Hayes called to him from the pulpit from which he was speaking. He said, "Pastor, I know you, don't I?" Pastor Keyes, not aware of knowing Pas-

tor Hayes, said, "No, I don't believe so." Then Rev. Hayes said, "What's your name?" Pastor Keyes replied, "Rev. Charles Keyes." Pastor Hayes said, "Charlie Keyes—helicopter pilot, Viet Nam, Da Nang."

Then Pastor Keyes remembered. He flew the mission that saved Rev. Hayes' life. Rev. Hayes was in a special unit that would go out to find out what happened to lost patrols. It was a very dangerous mission. He was a dangerous

that Father Moon was indeed sent by God.

He bought 20 Divine Principle books and began to teach with the Divine Principle in his Bible Studies. The members understood. The next year, Minister Ethel

Hayes, Rev. Hayes' wife, went to the Divine Principle seminar held in Virginia with Muslims, Christians and Jews. There she understood the teaching and got excited, because she could now fully understand the joy with which her husband was testifying to his church and all the clergy in Houston about the unfolding of the Bible that the Divine

Subsequently, Pastor Hayes, Minister Hayes, Minister Price Carruthers, receive the Blessing of marriage. By receiving the Blessing, believers can now become True Parents themselves. Believers are now entering the age in which they also can receive their crowns. I Peter 5:4 says, "And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away.' The crown of glory has now been lifted up at Gloryland. Truly this church is pioneering a new level of fellowship for the body of Christ and the preparation for the Second Coming.

On Sunday morning, Minister Chambers picked us up for Sunday service. The Bible and the Divine Principle book were in her back seat. She said, "I read the Principle every day. I love it. It gives so much insight into Jesus." I thought to myself, "Wow, Pastor Hayes' ministry is really strong! The ministers of his

church are studying very seri-

ously."

When my wife and I arrived at Gloryland the reality was greater than the descriptions I had heard. A large church one city block wide and another deep grew out of the original church that Pastor Hayes organized in 1989. Rev. Shin and Rev. Hernandez and their wives as well as a number of families from Texas joined us for the celebration. Minister Ethel Hayes was excited to assemble the ministerial staff with Rev and Mrs. Shin, Rev. Hernandez, and my wife and me for a photo that she wanted placed in the America Clergy magazine (the magazine of the American Clergy Leadership Conference).

Their banquet halls, dining rooms, VIP rooms and the sanctuary are all dedicated for the Glory of God. The ministerial staff all wear traditional black garb with clerical collars. They are serious about the Word.

Pastor Hayes was excited beyond description. His Divine

Principle book on his desk was frayed on the edges, and his leather Bible was well worn. He told me, "I'm reading the Principle every day. It's so exciting!'

We had come for the celebration of the pastor's anniversary on July 25. Rev. Levy Daugherty was asked to open it, and I was asked to close it out. Dr. Hayes believes and trusts the ACLC.

When the service began, the Cathedral Choir of Gloryland did a special procession into the sanctuary. Forty voices lifted our hearts with traditional and powerful Gospel hymns. The atmosphere was filled with joy.

Then Mr. Jenkins who heads up the Gloryland martial arts team brought out 20 young people who are studying Tae Kwon Do. A great demonstration was performed. The young people demonstrated not only technical skill but great spirit. In a demonstration of self defense, the "attacker" was aptly prevented from any success in his attack. They are training the mind, body and spirit to allow these beautiful young people to reach their full potential as the sons and daughters of God.

Some of the demonstrations were done by grade school students who were just over three and a half feet tall. At 6 feet, 2 inches tall, Mr. Gerald Jenkins is a master trainer and in excellent shape. The children half his height didn't care. They faced him down and in some cases flipped him over!! It was a joy! Mr. Jenkins (my namesake) is a

man; he had no fear and believed that America was worth fighting for. This time he got stuck in the bush, and the mission was deemed too dangerous for any pilot to go in. Captain Keyes volunteered and against all odds saved Dr. Haves' life.

In that moment in the pulpit, the two men became clear on their history. Rev. Keyes and Rev. Hayes bonded instantly. Rev. Keyes introduced Rev. Mark Hernandez to Pastor Haves and they held the 144,000 Blessing in their church. Latter that year, Rev. Hayes attended the Ocean City Workshop for clergy on the theme: "Who is Rev. Moon?"

At Ocean City, he learned of Rev. Moon's teaching that John the Baptist failed his mission. Quietly, Pastor Haves was disturbed by this and determined that he would leave Ocean City the next morning. However, that night he awakened from sleep with the words in his heart, "Read It!" He understood that the words that he felt meant he should read about John the Baptist. There, late at night, he read Matthew 11:11-12: "Verily I say unto you, Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a greater than John the Baptist: notwithstanding he that is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. And from the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force."


The lights went on. This is the truth and Jesus made it plain in the scriptures! Pastor Hayes felt a strong sense and Minster Chellis all went on pilgrimages to Israel. Pastor Hayes went on numerous occasions. His courage in Viet Nam came back when he went to the Erez crossing in Gaza. When the American consul warned that we might not survive the visit to Gaza and asked for our passport numbers so they could notify next of kin, Pastor Hayes testified that at that moment he saw absolutely no fear in the eyes of the key ACLC leaders. It reminded him of leaders he met in Viet Nam. Those who always survived were the ones who risked their lives and had no fear. They were the ones most protected.

This resonated with Pastor Hayes' spirit, for he himself has no fear. He became one with Father Moon's ACLC movement. He knew this is the one movement that can challenge the divisions of the people of God and bring unity where there is no hope. Pastor Hayes knows Jesus—the real Jesus. The one who is with us when our life is on the line. The one who will not forsake us.

With that spirit, Rev. Hayes began to fearlessly share the contents of the Divine Principle. When it came time to end the era of the cross, his church, which has a very strong membership both in spirit and in numbers, held a special ceremony to take down the cross. In its place over the baptismal, he placed the Crown of the King and the Crown of the Queen. The two crowns are for the True Parents—Jesus and the Holy Spirit, Father and Mother Moon, and all believers who

The Texas contingent of the ACLC is very strong. Rev. Willis is on the National Executive Committee of the ACLC. Rev. and Mrs. Hayes, Rev. Keyes, Rev. Willis, and Rev. Jimmie Clarke are

absolutely clear that Father Moon is the one whom God has called to bring in the kingdom. They know that Jesus is with him. Nothing can change it, and from what I saw in Gloryland rapid growth through the churches is now beginning to occur.

Rev. Willis brought Rev. and Mrs. Powell with her. Sister Powell has been a key organizer for the Women's Federation for World Peace for many years. She was excited to see her husband inspired about the ACLC spirit.

Just before I got up to speak, Minister Ethel Hayes asked everyone to stand. "I have an inspi-

ration," she announced. Her husband smiled. "All husbands and wives join hands," she asked. "This is a serious moment. The ministry has now taken on the central focus of bringing the grace of Jesus to the family through the Blessing of marriage. The power and the protection of the Holy Spirit is now covering the marriage. Divorce will be no more." She wrapped a white cloth around the joined hands of herself and her husband. She called for Rev. Hernandez to pray for the families.

She spoke so sincerely: "My husband and I are joined together in the Lord, and we are bound together in the love of Jesus. True Parents have brought the anointing of our family. We will never

be broken apart. God is with us."

Rev. Hayes and Rev. Mark Hernandez introduced me. I have such love and respect for the work that God is doing there. It was unusual for me to preach before a congregation that is so well prepared and has studied so deeply. The ministers and the congregation have crossed the Jordan River in trust for the pastor. They know without question that Jesus sent Father and Mother Moon.



I know now that many important Christian leaders are reading my testimonies in private and asking God sincerely, "Is this the hour of the coming of the Lord?"

Minister Hayes shared with me an interesting story. She and Rev. Maggie went to witness to an important pastor in Dallas, whose name is a household word. He is very open to ACLC and Minister Hayes. A group of ACLC women pastors are praying for him. They shared with me that he always welcomes them, knowing that they are with Father Moon.

Many Christian leaders are receiving revelations about Father Moon. Those who are truly praying and sincerely seeking are hearing the tender voice of Jesus leading them to Father Moon. Those who are really sincere are deeply troubled by the culture of sin and selfishness that is now challenging the very essence of faith and marriage. They don't feel the same power they once felt, because they know that God is doing a new thing before history.

That's why this famous pastor said to the ACLC clergywomen: "I'm interested because deep in my spirit I feel

that Christianity has to wake up and catch up because God is moving on and His dispensation is not static and remaining where the majority of Christians are. God is moving beyond the walls of denomination and faith now. The traditional boundaries are gone, yet many Christians want to keep the boundaries up because they are not confident that their faith can do anymore than save the individual."

This pastor believes that true Christianity created America, and true Christianity initiated the reconciliation between whites and blacks in America. True Christianity is based on faith in Jesus

and the practice of his love. Faith without practice yields a false Christianity. This false Christianity is the one that condones division, hatred and even (in the past) slavery.

This important pastor in Dallas is looking closely at ACLC. I was quite surprised to hear this testimony. Thousands of pastors are looking very closely.

The time has come. When the body of Christ unites together, a new America will emerge, one that is true to its founding spirit.

The sermon was well received. Pastor and Minister Hayes and Rev. and Mrs. Keyes received the Blessing with Holy Wine that opens the door for a new covenant between the believers and God. This covenant allows us to enter into the Fourth Israel.



My conclusion is this. Even True Father listens to the word of God everyday. I think that he would be the first to admit that these are not his words, but the word of God being expressed



My wife and I were deeply moved by what was shared this evening. This is a profound manifestation of the fact that the curtain has been opened between heaven and earth and all of our ancestors are coming down to participate with us in realizing God's Kingdom. However, as they come down a lot also has to be resolved to all for the restoration of histo-

Part of that restoration is unfolding in a way that is most needed. The leaders from Africa are seeking to reconcile with the African American brothers and sisters as historically there was betrayal and brothers were sold into slavery by their own brothers. The white man took advantage of this division and exploited the people. All of this must be resolved and restored. Noting the difference and the division between the brothers and sisters of Africa and the brothers and sisters of African descent in America the President of Benin, which was noted for slave trade, felt that repentance and reconciliation had to be initiated from Africa. While this was occurring our Unification leaders were receiving the



same inspiration and JAMII AFRICA was formed. JAMII is Zwahili for "Family". The reconciliation of the family is now being initiated. This in turn can open the door for the white brothers and sisters to repent and be forgiven.

Starting with President of Benin who was moved several years ago to host American clergy and political leaders—a ceremony was held to begin the process. Rev. Oliver shared along with Rev. Mungai many of the testimonies of this effort. Rev. Oliver showed a powerful video (BBC or similar in quality) of a documentary done on the conference held in Benin. It has very important implications. Featured in the video was the President and others from Benin repenting for this sad history and Amer-

ican clergy like Rev. Perrin from Washington D.C. receiving the apology and saying "All is Forgiven" let's move on from here.

The work of Jamii first came to my attention in an "End of the Era of the Cross" seminar put on by the ACLC of Baltimore with Rev. Howard and Rev. St. George Crosse and our

Washington/ Baltimore ACLC Community led by Bishop C. Phillip Johnson, Rev. McCarthy. It was a beautiful program. I had no idea that the ending would have a special part in the program that would call for African Christian leaders to come forward and repent to their brothers and sisters who were Americans of African descent.

Brothers and sisters, this was a very meaningful and pro-

found moment. It was very moving and powerful. Then in Rev. Olivers home in an incredible discussion and spirit that followed I was awakened to another aspect of God's work of restoration. (Also Fumi, Rev. Oliver's wife, prepared a 7 course meal that was world class immensely delicious—it gave confirmation of the love in their family).

This work can open the door for African, African Americans and white brothers and sisters to repent and be healed. It is a process. Our history is profoundly sad and we have not restored it yet. I thank God for the leaders of JAMII and the heart with which they are seeking to allow the ancestors which we are now seeking to bless to be comforted and liberated. This is the work

of God. For all of us to fulfill our role as Tribal Messiah's we must also establish our Tribe both in the spiritual world and through reconciliation on earth. The spirit of love, the presence of True Parents was so strong there last night at Rev. Olivers. I am moved to repent again and again. There is nothing more to say but that I am grateful to God to allow me to be part of this family and to experience the heart of the ancestors seeking to overcome the pain and come together as God desires.

Rev. Mungai brought it to another level. He said, to be liberated we must be filled with love and liberated from our resentment. He then shared his testimony of the fact that his grandfather had been brutally murdered by evil people. He then shared how he had to overcome his anger and resentment toward these people. It is real and it is not simple. God is working through this movement.

Brothers and Sisters—please support this effort — they will have a program on June 27th to raise funds. On July 29—August 7 they have been invited by the President of Benin as special guests along with many key ACLC leaders like Rev. Daugherty and many others. The President invited them to be a special part of the annual program he holds to heal the division of the "family".

I am grateful for my brothers and their wives for responding to God's call. Isn't it time that we set all things straight? True Parents are manifesting the Peace Kingdom and this is healing the hearts of all humanity.

I pray that the journey to Benin will open the flood gates of healing for all of God's children.

Thanks be to God and to all people of faith. Thanks to our African and African American brothers and sisters, leaders and ACLC clergy who responded to True Parents call and have protected Father every step of the way. There is no question that this particular family suffered more than any other and continues to do so, however in that suffering Jesus love was manifested for all enemies and therefore those who suffered the most became the source of healing to the world.






Mr. Saunders explained IIFWP's program in detail and highlighted the organization's commitment to work with the Zambian government. The Vice President explained that IIFWP has come at the



joined the Unification movement in San Francisco in 1976, but my first experience in my hometown wasn't until about 8 years later when I

was doing my summer of service from UTS. At that time Rev. Michael Jenkins was the regional leader, Mr. Reiner Vincenz was the State leader and Mrs. Sheri Reuter was the city leader.

Then Suddenly and without warning at the leaders meeting in the grand ballroom after the celebration on the day of the Victory of Love, 1987, Father assigned 75 American leaders to work with the ACC mission and I returned to my home town (after much prayer, asking God where he wanted me to go).

At that time we were beginning to work with a city councilman, a state representative and a state senator.

Through these next 17 years, these three leaders have become a Congressman, the Secretary of State and the State Treasurer.

True Parents actually advised us that it would be better to work with retired, rather than current elected officials, because of the flack that they might receive by being identified as having worked with our movement. We all know the stories

about ministers who were persecuted because of their involvement with the unification church. But somehow our work with these three elected officials just continued to grow and blossom.

The city councilman was elected to the county board, the state representative was elected to a county office and the state senator began to rise in the leadership ranks of her party. When I first met the state representative, he took me along to a service project with senior citizens. But rather than listen to a speech, he handed me a fork and a spatula and pointed at the awaiting barbecue grill. I spent the next 2 hours cooking hot dogs while he led acrobats as they entertained the sen-

He later participated in our ICUSA/Project Volunteer programs as we distributed food throughout the city. After being elected to a county office he came in his jogging suit and brought his acrobats to perform for the sisters at our WFWP bridge crossing conference. He had been to Japan,

so he also brought videotape highlights of their performances and television interviews in Japan. Needless to say he was a big hit! Then the next day he returned in a suit and tie as the elected county official and spoke to the WFWP gathering. It then took him over 1 hour to leave the hotel, because our beloved Japanese sisters demanded to take pictures with him. And our relationship only deepened after he became a state official. He joined our Parents Day Selection Committee and one



year his recommended nominee was chosen. So he took time off from his work and traveled to DC to participate in the Parents Day Ceremony. And of course, because of him, our US Senator and several of our US Congressman joined the ceremonies. Since that time our relationship has deepened even more. He has invited our Japanese missionaries to his office on several occasions (like 50-75 at a time) where he serves each one of them cokes and cookies and takes about 180,000 pictures with them. He has also attended several of True Parents speeches in our city and along with another congressman was one of only two elected officials to stay throughout True Parents entire speech.

The lady State Senator attended one of our early ALC Conferences in Washington DC and was duly impressed. She then participated in local ALC conferences and would take time to have lunch with Rev. Jenkins and I about once a year. In the meantime, we would meet her at many political events throughout the year (she once even mentioned that she was impressed at how much weight I had lost—this was shortly after I had returned from Chung Pyung). She really tried to go on one of our fact finding tours of the Soviet Union (she has her college degree in journalism) but the timing was not quite right. Since becoming our state's first elected female official she has sent many beautiful proclamations and letters honoring our True Parents and she has no reservations whatsoever about the direct language that she uses in honoring our True Parents.

> In the twenty something years since he was a city councilman has also participated in many of True Parents speech programs. He is known and loved by many of our ministers and I believe that their support for him and his support for us have a powerful mutual benefit. I remember how he came to speak at one of our national WFWP programs. He drove out to the hotel by himself (no aids or assistants) and he gave a heartistic and beautiful speech. He has participated in many of our programs in Washington, DC and we have developed a deep relationship with his key staff people both in DC and in his home district.

Through the years (over 20) I have attended many of his local functions (most often with one or more of my own children). I have gone to a new Post Office dedication, summer back to school fairs and fests, Town meetings and along with CARP/STF we have helped him in each of the past 3 years, as he serves over 600 senior citizens a beautiful Christmas dinner. Last night he held a thank you reception for all of his friends to celebrate his recent re-election to the US Congress. He walked around the room with his microphone thanking various people.

When he came to our table, he publicly thanked our True Parents for the opportunity to meet with world leaders, "ambassadors, princes and potentates," and for the opportunity to speak before the United Nations. For many years, he would never even accept the smallest honorarium until finally, almost through force he directed that our offering be directed to a local community charity.

These are three of our most long term political contacts. But there are many

more. We have had US Congressmen come to visit our local businesses, have lunch with us during the holiday season and I even fed pigs at the local county fair with someone who has become one of the leading political figures in

America. This man (after many conditions and much prayer) was able to greet our True Parents at their 80th birthday celebration in the US Capitol. He has also written several very personal and beautiful letters of greetings to our True Parents honoring their work with family issues in

On the most local level we have made a long lasting relationship with our church's own city councilman. He has responded by getting several city proclamations to honor our events over the years* and he has visited our church, attended our monthly prayer breakfast and he even delivered an "evangelical" proclamation reading at one of True Parents speeches in our city. We have helped him distribute athletic shoes, served at his annual Labor Day picnics and volunteered in other arenas. Then one day we walked out our front door and discovered that someone had put in a new sidewalk right in front of our church center. (In order to get a proclamation passed in our city, the councilman must read the entire proclamation before the entire body at their monthly meeting. Therefore every proclamation that he has proposed to honor our True Parents was read publicly.

Likewise, we have pursued a relationship with our Jewish Congresswoman. She represents a strongly Jewish section of our city which is where our church center is located. She attended the reception on capitol hill for our True Parents 80th birthday. Then this past summer, after a long time of negotiating schedule with her district director, she actually came and spoke at our Sunday Service. The fact that my mother and her mother had taught school together made the event even more special. She gave us a briefing on the situation in Iraq and I am proud to say that my parents were in the congregation.

So what am I really saying? I remember several years ago when we were supporting a project in another state. Eventually, we had to bring in our own ministers to witness to certain public officials. This is because their CAUSA graduates had not been taken care of. I even heard that during True Parents 50 city tour our members contacted a very prominent min-

It is our prayer that our small contribution will help the Aged at Mitanda Home for the Aged find True Love and happiness. �





ister in their state to see if True Parents could speak in his church. He said, "where in the world have you been all these years? I was invited to Korea in 1984 and I had the time of my life. But then I lost touch and didn't hear from anyone in the UC for almost 20 years. Several years ago in our city we held DP study sessions in one minister's church every Saturday morning for over one year. The church was a very nice but simple church and every week the minister took whatever small offering was raised and used it to improve the church in some way. By the end of the year he had replaced all the electrical work in the church and put in new pews. Then one day he gave his testimony. He said that in 1984 he had been invited to go on one of our CAUSA trips to Korea. When he was praying at the Rock of Tears in Pusan he received a vision of a church without a roof. Some years after he returned

home he began to look for a new church. One day after unsuccessfully looking at one church, he looked across the street and saw a simple humble church, but noticed that it had no roof. Needless to say, he bought that church and that was the church that we used to hold the DP study during that year. So often we have no idea about how much True Parents work affects everyone that it touches.

The successful work that we have done with the political leaders in our state has no magical formula. Most simply we have just continued to serve them and maintained contact with them on a consistent and regular basis. Sometimes it has been hard to connect with them as they have risen up the ladder and their local staff assistants have changed. The state treasurer returned my call one night well after midnight. She was at a national conference on the East Coast. She was nearly in tears as she shared with me how difficult it was to serve on the state level. Whereas before she had "only" 200,000 constituents, she now was responsible for

almost 11 million people—many of whom still expected the same personal attention that they had received when she was still a state senator. Even in our case, although we have maintained contact and met her on many occasions since she became a state-wide official, we have not been able to continue those annual personal lunch dates. However, last year, my 9 year old daughter chose for her social studies project, to make her a campaign poster and sent it to her as a Christmas Card. In response she invited my daughter to the state's inauguration ceremony (and she even allowed her to bring her dad along as a guest).

I truly believe that the good fortune that these elected officials are experiencing is directly related to their work with our movement. It has not always been easy to maintain our relationships, (after our very own state senator who knew Rev. Jenkins and I on a first name basis was elected to the US Senate, we couldn't even get a letter of greeting from him) but I truly believe that God will give us every opportunity to move the relationship to a deeper level over time.

Throughout history God has always tried to work through the prophet to reach the king. Samuel, Isaiah, Jeremiah and Nehemiah each stood in this position. Today, in 2004, the 21st century, the new millennium and the 4th year of the Cheon IL Gook, I do not think for one minute that God's desire has changed even one iota in this regard. I believe that our responsibility as Tribal Messiahs and more specifically those of us who have been chosen to be ACC/AFC leaders ordained by our True Parents, is to work with world and national political leaders as well as ministers, ambassadors, UN leaders and men and women of true faith to unite the prophet and the king to work together to bring peace to the world and to establish the Kingdom of God on Earth. And I truly believe that this is meant to be and will be established in our lifetime. ❖

he work-hard, playhard approach of PLA was effective. By Washington, D.C., which was the final stop on the '97 summer tour, the number of participants had swelled to 500, and members were welcomed by Mayor Marion Berry who recited the Pure Love Pledge with them. The tour itself generated three hours of television coverage and dozens of newspaper articles. It also contributed to the education and

maturation of the movement's second generation. In Boston, near the end of the tour, PLA held its second Absolute Sex speech competition. The first such

competition had been held at the Boulder, Colorado workshop halfway through the fifty-day tour.

According to one account, "Brothers and sisters who had been timid and awkward in Boulder now exploded into Heavenly impassioned fire breathers. They all had matured greatly in their logical and heartistic expressions not only of the pain and misery of broken families and false love but also of their longing and determination to strive for pure love for themselves and the world."

One Unification parent expressed pride and gratitude upon receiving the fax of a newspaper article in which his daughter was quoted "speaking out for what she believes" in a front-page story about the tour. Other parents were moved to tears of a different sort when their second-generation offspring took part in such PLA spin-off activities as bungee-jumping "purity" plunges. However, on balance, the scales tipped decidedly to the positive side.

Another positive benefit was the synergy that the tour created with the wider movement. The Pure Love

'98 tour to the Orient stimulated the development of parallel efforts suited to the particular context in Korea, Japan, Taiwan, Hong Kong and even on mainland China. The same occurred in Europe.

In 1999, PLA moved beyond an exclusively activist posture by creating CLUE 2000, a ten-chapter character development and abstinence education curriculum. The acronym stood for Creat-

ing Love and Uplifting Esteem, and the curriculum was built wholly around U.S. federal government guidelines for abstinence education. Previously, a theless, much of the cutting-edge creativity and knowhow was a product of the American movement and its contacts. This was much the same for the movement's efforts on behalf of pure love and second-generation education. In all of this, the U.S. movement as well as currents within American Christianity in the wider U.S. society played an important, perhaps even an elder-son role.

Elder Sonship

As was previously noted, Rev. Moon elevated the United States to the status of "elder son" nation to the "parent" nations of Korea and Japan in 1998.

This was done with little fanfare probably because he and much of the movement's senior Korean and Japanese leadership were still ambivalent about American culture. On the one hand, they acknowledged U.S. political, economic, military and cultural ascendancy as the world's only superpower. Movement leaders, unlike many in American society, also affirmed the United States' identity as a "Christian" nation. They also admired the U.S. as a cultural melting pot. On the other hand, they were uncomfortable with core American cultural norms. Coming out of a traditional, neo-Confucian context, which to a large extent was identified as being closer to "heavenly" culture, the movement's East Asian leadership had a particularly dif-

ficult time fathoming the American concept of equality. For them, it was perfectly obvious that there was no equality. Rather, everyone knew their position in a secure familial-based social order resembling what in the medieval West was known as "the great chain of being." This clearly was an oversimplification as East Asia, no less than other world cultures, grappled with the competing forces of tradition and modernity. Nevertheless, within the movement, members tended to relate across cultural divides on the basis of broad-ranging cultural stereotypes.

Even more disturbing than conflicting cultural norms was what the movement's East Asian leadership experienced as an abrasive and imperial cultural style. In general, these leaders were used to more understated, deferential modes of relating than many Americans were inclined to render. Frank styles of interaction, including the expression of disagreement with scant acknowledgement of a given leader's need to save face, created distance as did its opposite: the assumption of more familiarity than one's central figure was willing to concede. However, these were minor irritants. What really disturbed Rev. Moon and the movement's top Asian leadership was the American air of cultural superiority: that the U.S. was always on the side of righteousness, or at least was the leading force for goodness in the world; that there was something wrong with anyone who couldn't speak English; and that leadership was an American entitlement. This may have induced Rev. Moon to emphasize U.S. faults, the necessity to learn Korean, and the primacy of Oriental leadership more than otherwise might have been the case. He also did very



PLA educational team had created many activities for young teenagers. These also were incorporated into the text. During the fall, the curriculum was taught in eighteen public schools in Chicago which was a focus of STF and PLA concentration. One report noted that PLA student-teachers, primarily secondgeneration STF volunteers, had access to 1,200 students and that each student received ten hours of abstinence education which was "12,000 hours of abstinence education being taught in the schools this fall that was not there before!" The report stated that the curriculum was also being taught "in after-school programs and communities in many states and several countries throughout the world.

The outcome of all these initiatives became clearer at the decade's end. It was clear, first, that the Unification movement had targeted the issues of moral education and family values, as well as the assumptions upon which they rested, as the main focus of its worldwide activities during the 1990s. The True Family Values Ministry, the globalization of the Blessing, guidance from the spirit world, Ideal Family Education Workshops, and the movement's major educational efforts all focused on this area. It was clear, second, that the American movement was playing a leading role. Many of the movement's key initiatives in its earlier victory over communism struggle—The Washington Times, the World Media Association, CAUSA International, the CAUSA Ministerial Alliance, CARP rallies, and the activities of innumerable movement-funded organizations all emerged out of the American context. To be sure, there was essential overseas funding and leadership. Never-

their blessing and offer it to me." He stated, "the elder son inherits the mother's spirit and attends his father through the mother's education." In this respect, the designation of the U.S. as elder son nation did not appear to be a dramatic departure from what was already

addressed us directly very briefly on the first evening. I have one sentence of him speaking in English: "Please live by the tradition and way of True Parents." We were fortunate that one Korean sister who lives in America stayed for the entire workshop and helped translate. Father did say at one point that the children (America) were witnessing or participating in the relationship between the mother and father nations, Japan and Korea. Father, I believe, needed some American representation there to experience the Mother and Father nations becoming one."

If given a choice, many Americans may have pre-

ferred being knee-deep in the Pantanal without insect repellant to sitting through all-day Hoon Dok Hae readings and lectures with scanty or non-existent translations.

There were some efforts to define the identity and mission of elder sonship more proactively. Significantly, none of those who did so, at least in print, were American leaders or members. Rev. Joong Hyun Pak was Continental Director of the Unification Church in North America at the time Rev. Moon designated the U.S. elder son nation. In an article, "Elder Son Nation and Blessing '98," he took a conservative line, indebted to neo-Confucian presuppositions, in speaking of the position and duties of the elder son designation. The elder son was "always expected to be the role model for the others to follow" even "to spank the younger siblings when they needed discipline." It was "also the duty of the elder son to take care of the parents."

As applied to an Elder Son nation, "This nation is responsible...to bear the burdens of the other nations...representing brothers and sisters throughout the world. Never complaining; just accepting the responsibility. Always working hard, setting the best example."

On the positive side, "Parents invest everything into the elder son," and as Rev. Pak noted, "True Parents always brought help from other nations to America, raising and nurturing America." However, now that "the training period is over, America must be ready to take care of other nations in the same way it has been helped." Rev. Pak did not limit his remarks entirely to an exposition of duties and position. "While fulfilling this role," he suggested, "America will naturally start to become the Kingdom of Heaven on Earth, expanding out to the world." �

This, in turn, pushed him into positions he might not otherwise have taken regarding women's access to careers or even checking accounts. To Rev. Moon's credit, he overcame these cultural predispositions in designating the U.S. the elder son nation. However, it wasn't clear that this designation had any immediate practical effect other than being a signal to U.S. budget holders that they should not expect the funding they once received. Perhaps, the clearest indication that the American movement

had been well trained was in the lack of any serious expectation among members that they were about to assume any significant leadership of the movement's worldwide activities. Rev. Moon remarked that Americans should "[r]eceive a servant's certificate from Japan—get

19, 2003, called "Gays on TV." The reporter, Terence Smith, stated, "Just a few years ago, the subject was nearly taboo. This season there are some 20 series, dramas or reality shows, that feature gay and lesbian life."

Smith interviewed Suzanna Walters, the author of *All the Rage: The Story of Gay Visibility in America*. Walters said, "The options for lesbians and gays ten, fifteen years ago were either complete invisibility or awful, heinous, you know, vicious stereotypes. There's been this sea change in our culture, where gays and lesbians have entered into the popular imagination in mainstream television, network and cable television, films, advertising."

Bennett is ominous in his conclusion: "Television, radio, newspapers, magazines, and the Internet—the media are the means. Kirk and Madsen have succeeded."

Cohen offers even less comfort, stating, "Welcome to my world. Read it and weep."

Most Americans are busy and hardworking, with little time to research the machinations of homosexual and lesbian activists. One conclusion that ordinary citizens can draw is that as a nation, we've been "snookered." The dictionary definition of *snooker* is "to fool; dupe," as in "snookered by a lot of malarkey."

The manipulation that Kirk and Madsen write about is being piped into American homes, via television and films, at an ever-increasing rate. With a high percentage of the Hollywood film industry dominated by gays and lesbians, the stream of pro-gay material is not likely to cease anytime soon.

Americans, who love and honor fair play and individual freedom, have taken a tolerant view of the private relationships among homosexuals and lesbians. Gay activists have championed gay marriage as a private affair that is part of an individual's civil rights. It is a rare American who won't defend civil rights.

Lost in the verbiage are the longrange consequences if gay marriage becomes legal in all fifty states. MarriageWatch, a service of the Marriage Law Project, has published a "Talking Points" Web page about the Defense of Marriage Act. Its overview of the impact of legalized gay marriage on American society is chilling. The most immediate victims of gay marriage will be children. MarriageWatch points out that since gay and lesbian couples cannot have children, they will have to utilize the services of a third person to provide the missing egg or sperm. This will force the children into the position of either never knowing their real but missing father or mother, or relating to the odd parent out as a "third parent."

Nationally legalized gay marriage will create a firestorm of public school curriculum modifications. Schools will be forced by gay activist lawsuits to present homosexual and lesbian marriage

> as normal. Private schools may not be exempt. Future generations of schoolchildren, from kindergarten on up, will be forced to recognize Mr. and Mr. Jones as a validly married couple. In their drive to "reduce teen pregnancies," liberal sex-education "experts" from the school of Alfred Kinsey and Wardell Pomeroy will encourage students to engage in homosexual and lesbian sex as a viable way to avoid pregnancy—the ultimate

in "safe sex." Gay activist groups

such as the Human Rights Campaign Foundation are already pushing for

the addition of gay and lesbian curricula to the public schools, from "children's first years in school." Bennett believes that the "homosexual's main goal is to wipe out 'homophobia' in one generation—by getting the children now."

A commonsense approach to marriage is needed to counter the clever marketing of the gay and lesbian lobbies. In a *USA Today* commentary on February 23, 2004, Dick Richardson, director of political affairs for the Black Ministerial Alliance of Boston, stated it simply: "We have always found that every child has an innate need to connect with a mother and a father. Children instinctively seek a connection to both halves of the human race."

America has survived and been victorious through many crises, including that of the Civil War and the civil rights movement led by Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. We owe it to our ancestors and future generations to win the battle of marriage and the family.

This two-part article is about marriage. It's something we Unificationists are famous for, and justly so. Our success rate is high, and my own 1982 mass wedding was covered on the front page of the New York Times. Please note that my discussion becomes rather gritty. We'll get into further detail next month, in part two.

eople marry for all sorts of reasons, personal and otherwise. Marrying for love is a fine tradition, and some claim it's a newer one, stemming from the Romantic period of enlightenment France. I'd say it's as ancient as humanity itself. No one can read the Bible's Song of Solomon and imagine it describes some dry, arranged-for-convenience match-up.

We Unificationists perform a lot of arranged marriages, but we don't base them upon selfish economic or political concerns. It's really about heart, for this and future generations.

Getting hitched ain't easy. Building serious, lasting relationships is a terrific challenge. As the old timers say: "Women! Can't live with 'em, can't live without 'em."

These days, selfish guys can easily "get the milk for free," so they don't even bother with marriage. Sure, they'll say enough to keep her hopeful, but never quite get around to real commitment. And yet, guys do recognize marriage as a better, more ideal, possibility. So does society at large. Everyone dreams of finding a soulmate.

America does everything big, and supports a gigantic wedding industry, to the tune of about \$70 billion per year. Traditional ceremonies involve ornate settings, and expensive caterers, florists, gown makers, musicians, card printers, and more. Wedding photographers, harried as they often are, usually deserve the money. Japan's modern style is, if anything, even more extravagant.

These days, couples often write their own vows, and find liberal ministers happy to recite them. This can be a wonderful thing, especially when they don't leave out any important parts...

Difficulties

So is it 'equally yoked,' as the Bible says, or the feminist's 'chained by oppressive tradition?' Marriage does have its down side. Older laws made wives themselves into property (still true within Islam); not to mention, whatever the bride owned or earned came under exclusive control of the man.

For a very long time, many priests and rabbis told battered wives to "just take it." This was (supposedly) allowed in order to correct feminine disrespect or incompetence. Pastors would say it's something to be endured, in the same way Jesus allowed Himself to be wounded.

Nowadays, plenty of women are expected to wear awkward fashions

(such as high heels), and to have (or obtain) large bosoms, all to satisfy their husband's Freudian whims.

In past decades, millions of poor Americans (including mothers) remained single, encouraged by welfare policies and lax social norms. Over the years, this disastrous practice has spread throughout society.

President Bush has established government programs to encourage young people, and unwed couples, to get and stay married. Noble as this effort sounds, it's getting opposition, mostly from activists who claim it isn't realistic.

The poor do face serious obstacles to marriage, such as addiction, debt,

and incarceration. The blame, and possible solutions, are all over the map. Recent studies, in a very un-politically correct finding, indicate that a person's health and wealth closely matches their IQ level. Apparently this has to do with the growing complexity of medical advice and treatment, and of modern jobs and finances, plus a generational cycle of childhood deprivation.

Of course, anyone can learn and practice God's truth, and healthy living

habits, but for some it's an awfully big challenge . . .

In Third World countries such as India, weddings require a huge dowry plus a lavish party, which places extreme pressure upon families with girls. As they grow up, these women face terrible hazards, like (so-called) 'honor killings,' as when a rape victim gets punished far more severely than the perpetrator.

As every nation advances into modernity, and learns of the Divine Principle, their marriages will become fairer and more loving.

Opposition

Even as modern marriage spreads worldwide, it faces trouble at home. Since Marx's time, it's been under attack. Lenin tried to abolish marriage in Russia, but he couldn't pull it off.

Later, feminists did their best to scorn and devalue marriage. In an ironic twist, now they don't have many children, and so lack an instrument to pass along their radical ethos. (As college professors, they sure do try!)

Today it's the homosexual activists, who've switched tactics by embracing marriage. Therefore, much of this article will focus on that issue. (Please note that your author has had gay friends and coworkers for thirty-four years, and we get along fine, thank you.)

"How can you oppose love?" the gays say to conservatives, and then toss back accusations of promiscuity: "Allow us to form solid legal bonds and maybe we won't play around so much."

Previously, most gays derided marriage as a constricting, bourgeois institution. Now it's touted, for the most part quite sincerely, as a means of personal fulfillment and wider social acceptance. "See our happy couples and you'll stop worrying," they assure us. (Surveys back their idea, with acceptance

much greater among America's youth.)

One oft-heard proposal is to let the government simply license consenting adults to marry, and let the churches pick and choose, offering sacred ceremonies to whomever they will—or won't. Activists ask, "How does gay marriage threaten the traditional kind, anyway?"

The answer is a long one. Gay marriage would be included in children's books and school curriculums, plus it'll infuse the popular culture more than ever. Related laws will create a new, prosecutable form of discrimination.

Many gay men admit that their mar-

ine: this is a relationship in which degradation and painful abuse are not only acceptable, but expected. Its advocates love to hint at the number of 'closeted' ministers, politicians, etc., who practice that lifestyle. (As if that supposedly impressive number becomes an extra justification.)

To a non-lawyer like me, San Francisco Mayor Newsom's legal argument, in favor of gay marriage, is obviously inclusive. If every adult, and couple, has equal civil rights, then how can you possibly exclude anyone?

In the end, marriage could become so diluted as to obscure its meaning entirely. (And then there's the ongoing

lower-the-age-of-consent movement...)

Healing


Marriage is in trouble. It needs to be strengthened, not excused or confused. Teenaged pregnancy is down, while the first gay divorces have already been filed. Can an afternoon TV show called Gay Divorce Court be far behind? Medical science, with cloned babies soon to arrive, is only going to make things more

complicated.

State and Federal marriage laws are under to ferocious assault, with both sides calling the future of liberty, and of civilization itself, into question. This time, they're likely correct.

All people, of whatever culture, economic status, or proclivity, need to be supported and healed—not scorned or derided. The Principle, whether in book form or shown by PowerPoint, can illuminate these issues better than anything else around.

rying wouldn't entail sexual monogamy. The lifestyle omits chastity and fidelity, almost by definition. Such men, with their definitive act, engage in dangerous sex (medically speaking). Lesbians have a 100% infertility rate, and obtaining sperm can be an emotional and legal risk.


ing to compromise, with laws for domestic partnerships and such. This 'live and let live' attitude is a fine American tradition. Too bad it's not recipro-

Gay Marriage and the Future of Our Children

n February 24, 2004, President George W. Bush issued a clarion call to the nation. Speaking from the Roosevelt Room of the White House, the president stated, "If we are o prevent the meaning of marriage from being changed forever, our nation must enact a constitutional amendment to protect marriage in America.

Calling marriage "the most undamental institution of civiization," the president stated hat "the voice of the people must be heard." Sen. John Kerry of Massachusetts, expected to be he president's Democratic oppoient in November, has stated hat he would vote against a mariage amendment.

The effort to create a federal narriage amendment has been gathering steam since Colorado Republicans Rep. Marilyn Musgrave and Sen. Wayne Allard, oined by a broad coalition of Democratic and Republican leaders, introduced bills HJ RES 56

and SJ RES 26 in 2003, calling for such in amendment. The proposed amendnent would state, "Marriage in the United States shall consist only of the union of a man and a woman. Neither this Constitution, nor the Constitution of any State, nor State or Federal law, shall be construed to require that marital status or the legal incidents thereof be conferred upon unmarried couples or groups.'

The Alliance for Marriage, a northern Virginia educational organization ounded by Matt Daniels, crafted the proposed amendment with the assisance of Judge Robert Bork and other constitutional scholars. The amendnent must be supported by two-thirds of the House and Senate and then ratfied by three-fourths (or 38) of the states or it to become part of the U.S. Constitution. The bills now in front of the 108th Congress have until this Novemper's presidential election, when Congress adjourns, to be voted on and become law. Currently, over 100 mem-

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bers of Congress are listed as cosponsors of HJ RES 56. The environment in the states is ripe for a federal marriage amendment. Thirty-four states already have a "Defense of Marriage" law in place, and four states have added a marriage amendment to their consti-

Congress passed the Defense of Marriage Act in 1996, which President Clinton signed. Senator Kerry and thirteen other senators voted against the act.



The federal marriage amendment has been introduced because of fears that the Defense of Marriage Act, which defines marriage as the union of a man and woman, may be challenged by a liberal court system. A constitutional amendment is seen as the only sure way to preserve the traditional definition of marriage.

The issue was brought into sharp focus on November 18, 2003, when the Massachusetts Supreme Court ruled in Goodridge v. Department of Public Health that the Massachusetts ban on same-sex marriage was unconstitutional. The actions of the liberal court engendered a strong public response.

A coalition of over 3,000 Massachusetts religious organizations issued a statement on February 7, asking the state legislature to pass a statelevel constitutional amendment to counter the Goodridge ruling.

Recent national polls have shown that most Americans are opposed to

gay and lesbian marriage. A November 2003 poll from the Pew Research Center stated that 59 percent of Americans were opposed to gay marriage, with opposition rising to 80 percent among evangelical Protestants. The Episcopal Church, widely thought of as liberal in its attitudes toward gays and lesbians, has been in turmoil since it consecrated a gay priest, V. Gene Robinson, as bishop of New Hampshire in November 2003. In January, in opposition to the

election of Bishop Robinson, delegates from 12 of the 107 Episcopal dioceses formed a new organization called the Network of Anglican Communion Dioceses and Parishes. It remains to be seen whether the Episcopal Church will split over the issue.

With most of the major religions and historical American customs standing in clear opposition to gay marriage, how is it that traditional marriage is suddenly in such jeopardy?

Stephen Bennett, a Christian speaker who was an active homosexual until the age of 28, having had relationships with over

100 men, believes that the current marriage crisis is the result of a well-planned campaign by gay and lesbian activists during the last fifteen years. Now married, with a little boy and girl, he spreads his message nationally that "no one is born that way ... it has everything to do with childhood and complete change is completely possible."

Bennett is joined in his opinion that homosexuality can be reversed by a slew of nonprofit organizations, many of them founded and staffed by former gays and lesbians. P.A.T.H. (Positive Alternatives to Homosexuality) is a "nonprofit coalition of organizations that

help people with unwanted same-sex attractions (SSA) realize their personal goals for change—whether by developing their innate heterosexual potential or by embracing a lifestyle as a single, nonsexually active man or woman." One of the organizations listed on the P.A.T.H. Web site is the International Healing Foundation, established by psychotherapist Richard Cohen in 1990. Cohen is the author of Coming Out Straight: Understanding and Healing Homosexuality, a guide for individuals wishing to make a transition from the homosexual lifestyle.

To clarify the genesis of the current marriage crisis, Bennett and Cohen both point to a manual of homosexual and lesbian strategy, written in 1989 by Marshall Kirk and Hunter Madsen and published by Doubleday/Bantam. The book, After the Ball: How America Will Conquer Its Fear and Hatred of Gays in the 90's, is a sophisticated marketing strategy of manipulation that uses terms such as "desensitize," "jam," and "convert '

The authors state, "by Conversion we actually mean something far more profoundly threatening to the American Way of Life, without which no truly sweeping social change can occur. We mean conversion of the average American's emotions, mind, and will, through a planned psychological attack, in the form of propaganda fed to the nation via the media. We mean 'subverting' the mechanism of prejudice to our own ends—using the very processes that made America hate us to turn their hatred into warm regard—whether they like it or not."

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
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
